

# Collector's Corner: Corfield Periflex By Gordon Risk

This month's collectable is the British-made Corfield Periflex. In 1950, Kenneth Corfield, a young entrepreneur, saw a need for a new 35mm camera, since the post –war Britain camera industry had outdated designs, a lack of investment, and a failure to recognize the market needs. Plus, the war had diminished imports. Mr. Corfield saw an opportunity and started a company with his younger brother, K.G. Corfield from Wolverhampton, producing various photographic accessories before producing a camera.

My late model Gold Star preset lens with coated e Japanese camera producing photographic accessories before producing a camera.

Their cameras were compatible with the Leica, having a 39mm screw mount which was the standard of the day from Germany. The camera looked like a rangefinder with

a focal plain shutter and an unusual through-thelens periscope reflex rangefinder. This inverted periscope, after focusing, quickly moves up and out of the way as you press the shutter release.

My late model Gold Star has a 50mm f2.8 Corfield Lumax preset lens with coated elements. By the Sixties, cheaper Japanese camera products were being imported, and the company finally closed in 1971. ### **Autumn Trip To Vermont 2016** By Vella Kendall

Vermont is one of our favorite states, and we have visited frequently when we were younger and could still ski. Vermont is beautiful in the winter also, and I recommend a trip even if one does not ski. The restaurants and shops are open throughout the year. There are a lot of gourmet restaurants and craft shops.

As the days passed, the foliage filled in very nicely. The colors were bright and the trees were full with beautifully colored leaves. We had good weather and were able to wear shorts—there were only two cold days. There are many back roads and one does not have to hike to take good photos. This year there has been a drought and it was thought that the leaves would be good because of the drought, but due to dryness, the leaves would be colorful one day and drop to the ground the next. There were so many trees, it did not seem to matter to us. Some of the rivers were down to the bed, and that eliminated some reflection shots, but we were able to scout out some places for reflections. Of course, the wind would show up also. A fun thing to do in Stowe (besides visiting the town) is to take the Toll Road up (one of Stowe's green ski runs). It does cost money, and it does get crowded with parking, but we were fine. There are beautiful views and hiking trails, of which one which goes to the summit. The back roads are where one can find gems or duds. We looked for moose, but did not see any. Unfortunately, we didn't see any wildlife except for some crows and ducks.

We also went up in the tram at Jay Peak Ski Resort. It's a fun ride and there are trails that come back down the mountain. Unfortunately, there was a lot of haze once we got up

top, and we were there mid-day so not the best photo conditions. They were going to close the tram after that weekend, so if you go, make sure it will be operating. There is a pizza place and a sandwich/grocery store open.

Another interesting spot was Bennington with an old church where Robert Frost is buried. It is actually called The Old First Church. It has a beautiful graveyard in a beautiful neighborhood. The church is open for sightseeing. As we drove back to Baltimore it became greener and greener. It was still green as we got back home. It seems here in Baltimore, our leaves are dropping without changthough there was plenty ing colors. So happy we got to go to Vermont this year.







#### In Their Words: Paul Biederman



#### What was your very first camera?

My very first camera was a "little spy camera" that took movie film. I developed the negatives in my bathroom sink and printed contact prints which I viewed through a magnifying glass. My first photo event was my Grandparents' 50th anniversary. I was able to preserve images of relatives. My first "professional" camera was a Nikon FTN with a 55mm MicroNikor lens and a Lester Dine ring flash (1970). It was basically used to document oral pathology.

## What do you consider essential gear to take on a shoot, particularly if you need to travel light?

This is a constantly evolving phenomena. (When traveling light, do you mean that my wife is not lugging my gear, or I am not? Anyway.) Strategically, I decide my primary goal, and that is how I choose my lens and body. My clothing and any protective-medical gear is next, followed by nourishment. I try to avoid food/liquid intake, to decrease the need for potty breaks.

## What person, place, or thing inspired you to become a photographer? Why?

In the Cub Scouts, my Den Mother (my mother) introduced me to taking and developing contact prints and then hand coloring them using q-tips and toothpicks. After my first MVA (2/2005) when I could no longer participate in endurance sports, I focused on my photography, and my therapist (after seeing my portfolio) encouraged me to pursue photography as a vocation and for therapeutic rehabilitation.

## Which 3 people, living or dead, would you like to have for dinner and conversation? Why?

I assume that you mean for photography? Clyde Butcher, Lee Varis, and Gregory Heister.

## What is one piece of advice you would like to offer to others on following their bliss in photography?

"Accomplishment is the culmination of dreams, dream big. (© Paul Biederman, 2004)" That was/is advice I gave to my daughter some ten years ago at the start of her triathlon career when she finished her first event. I apply it to all of my life. (Also read a prayer from Mother Theresa every morning, and be grateful for waking up!)

"Life is an opportunity, benefit from it.

Life is beauty, admire it.

Life is a dream, realize it.

Life is a challenge, meet it.

Life is a duty, complete it.

Life is a game, play it.

Life is an adventure, dare it.



#### In Their Words: Bill Bitman

#### What was your very first camera?

My first camera was a Kodak Instamatic in 1964, obtained when I was in high school, just in time for the New York World's Fair. In College, I purchased my first 35mm camera, an Olympus Trip 35. In graduate school, in 1973, I purchased a Minolta SRT 201, my first SLR. Way back then the typical kit was a set of 3 lenses: 35mm, 50mm, and 135mm. I used my cameras mostly for family and travel photos.

## What do you consider essential gear to take on a shoot, particularly if you need to travel light?

When I fly to a destination, I take a Think Tank backpack as my carry-on. Previously, I would take the wheeled camera backpack model. But eventually, airlines were requiring wheeled carry-ons to be checked in. Therefore, I purchased the Think Tank backpack model without wheels. I pack it with one camera body, currently the Nikon D810. I also pack the Nikon 70-200mm f/2.8 lens along with the Nikon 24-70mm f/2.8 lens. I also take the Nikon 17-35mm f/2.8 lens which is especially good for landscapes. I also include a polarizing filter and a tele-converter lens.

## What person, place, or thing inspired you to become a photographer? Why?

I was a biology major in college, and I earned a masters degree in genetics. For the first 10 years of my professional

life I was a medical research biologist. Throughout my university experiences, I had the privilege of using the best optics, cameras and microscopes, made by Nikon, Zeiss, and Leica. This inspired and motivated me to develop my own approach to nature photography with my own camera.

## Which 3 people, living or dead, would you like to have for dinner and conversation? Why?

- 1. Arturo Toscanini. His unique percussively emphatic interpretive renditions of the music of Beethoven, Brahms, and other composers are unsurpassed, even after 60 years of alternate recordings. His support of Israel and his public statements about the world's responsibility to help holocaust survivors made him a voice for morality at a critical time in history.
- 2. Thomas Mangelsen. His wildlife images are an inspiration to me in my attempt to create my own vision of the natural world. His road to recognition was not smooth, fast, or easy. I can relate to that.
- 3. Moses Maimonides. His Guide To The Perplexed and many other books on philosophy and legal matters delineated a rationalist approach to life and society. His writings reflect the same ideas as Francis Bacon, Rene Descartes, and Immanuel Kant, 400 years before these great philosophers guided the development of modern Western civilization.

## What is one piece of advice you would like to offer to others on following their bliss in photography?

Join a camera club and submit your images as entries in competitions. You will experience great angst and disappointment when you hear critical comments about your work. And your heart will sink when your beloved images are rejected by judges. But my advice is to keep at it and be inspired by the artwork of others. Your art will improve. For me, attending lectures and competitions at BCC has brought me to the realization that I am not a photographer. Rather, I am merely a nature lover who wants to share my experiences with others through images. Nonetheless, a few of my images have managed to be selected as competition-worthy.

Providing a venue for sharing our images is one of the functions of the Club: we share through competitions, Facebook, photoshoots, the annual competition and in other ways. Some members also share through exhibitions outside of the club. This is a great way to share your work with others who may see your images very differently than a club member or competition judge. It is also a means to drive your work forward as you open your "image closet" to the wide world, you want those images to be the very best you can make them.

Members are currently involved in at least three shows that I am aware of. I currently have 12 images exhibited at Zella's Pizzeria in southwest Baltimore. I became aware of this opportunity through the Sowebo Community (<a href="http://soweboarts.org/">http://soweboarts.org/</a>) and the Adler Gallery which works to bring more art to that part of Baltimore. It costs only \$30 to join the Adler Gallery and there are four small exhibits each year, with separate opportunities for shows like mine at Zella's.

With Charles Bowers, Karen Dillon, Jon Meyer and Sukumar Balachandran (Suku) I am also involved in a show, starting in January at the Bernice Kish Gallery at Slayton House in Columbia (<a href="https://www.wildelake.org/events-programs/the-bernice-kish-gallery-at-slayton-house/">https://www.wildelake.org/events-programs/the-bernice-kish-gallery-at-slayton-house/</a>).

Finally, all BCC members been invited to participate in an exhibit at the Fairhaven retirement community and each member was able to submit 2-3 images. Two nice things about this one is that it isn't juried, so any image submitted by a member will be hung, and it is free (although there is a commission if anything is sold).

A great place to keep track of opportunities for exhibits is the Maryland Art Place which posts "Calls for Entry" which means that there is a gallery or other venue looking for images to display.

I urge all members to try to expand their photographic horizons to include at least one exhibit -- it can be very rewarding.
