The Strength of Place By Lewis Katz

At times it is the subject matter you remember, not one specific image. One of the benefits of familiarity with an area is being able to use memory as a previsualization tool. As I headed north on 83 towards southern York County, where I lived for many years, I began seeing this barn in my mind's eye. I knew exactly where it was and the light on another one of our endless rainy misty days was just right.

The barn hasn't been touched in many, many years and is now is the process of giving itself up to the forces of nature. As a photographer you actually give yourself up to the forces of nature as well. All of your technical prowess is at the whim of the changing light and the scene in front of you. It is ultimately a unique combination of the strength of place, the quality of light and your interpretation of the scene that produces higher quality images.





In Their Words: Vickie Gray

Editor's note: Vickie Gray gave a presentation to a standing-room-only gathering of the club on July 14, 2016, called "Using Social Media to Promote Your Photography." What was your very first camera?

My first ever SLR was a Sony a580 purchased in 2011. Before that I only had a marginal interest in photography. I recently upgraded to a Sony a7rii. While I was packing away my old gear, I realized how important that first Sony was to

me. I worked hard to learn its ins and outs, while at the same time learning the basics of photography. I became a photographer with that camera.

What do you consider essential gear to take on a shoot, particularly if you need to travel light?

When I travel, I take my camera and a "walk around" lens, which is now a 24-70mm. I use only a wrist strap to carry the camera, and clothing with pockets for lens caps, etc. I carry a 13" tablet/laptop (Lenovo Yoga) and a large capacity thumb drive. Every evening I transfer photos from the memory card to the drive, review all of them and delete as many as I can so I don't have to edit hundreds of images when I get home. I never travel with a tripod. If I feel I'll need one I take a heavy duty Gorillapod. The Sony a7rii is terrible on batteries – I purchased four and will carry them and a charger with me at all times. If necessary I'll use a vertical grip. My travel photos are usually streetscapes or candid people, so this setup works fine. My greatest concern currently is care of my camera and lenses during extreme temperatures. Last year in New Orleans and in Havana I stayed in hotel rooms that were frigid. When I took my gear outside there was a lot of condensation on the camera and it did some damage. I just signed up for an online course in travel photography where one entire session is devoted to caring for your equipment in harsh climates.

What person, place, or thing inspired you to become a photographer? Why?

About ten years ago I began working regularly with images as we all transitioned to digital, online marketing. You need lots more images in the digital content world than in print communications. I developed very strong opinions on photos, in editorial and stock photography and in portraits of professionals that I worked with.

Those photographs inspired me to start taking my own pictures, to try to emulate the great images.

Which 3 people, living or dead, would you like to have for dinner and conversation? Why?

Fidel Castro – the 1960 version, right after the revolution. He brought hope and dignity to the common people in Cuba, even though he rapidly became an anti-American dictator.

Pope Francis – I'm not Catholic but his compassion and humility have been an inspiration to me.

Cecile Richards – president of Planned Parenthood and daughter of former Texas governor Ann Richards. She has been doing an amazing job of leading that organization through unbelievable adversity.

If all three came to dinner at the same time I guess I'd have to hide the cutlery.

What is one piece of advice you would like to offer to others on following their bliss in photography?

Respect your photos. Whether you take them with a cell phone or a Hasselblad, they represent an incredible amount of your time and effort. Present them properly, whether online on a website or in print. Frame them. Use the highest quality materials you can afford. Tell their story. Never compare them to anyone else's work. Be proud of what you shoot wherever you happen to be in your stage of development.



In Their Words: Roger Miller

What was your very first camera?

My first camera was a Brownie with 120 film. My next was an Argus C-3, which I took over from my dad when he got a movie camera.

What do you consider essential gear to take on a shoot, particularly if you need to travel light?

I usually, even if I am traveling light, take my back pack and my vest. In my back pack, I have two D700 with two Tamron 28.0-300.00 mm, f3.5-6.3 lenses. I also have a Nikon 14.0 mm f2.8 lens. I have a back up D300 with a 18.0-250.0 mm, f 3.5-6.3 Tamron lens. I like to have back up cameras. My standing joke with shooting is if someone else doesn't get the shot, oh well. If I don't get the shot, I don't eat!

What person, place, or thing inspired you to become a photographer? Why?

I have always liked doing photos, but what really cemented the idea was my time spent at Boston University. I began taking photos to paint from them. However, the first time I began to develop photos, it was a *WOW* moment!

Which 3 people, living or dead, would you like to have for dinner and conversation? Why?

This was a great question. I began with Alexander the Great, Julius Caesar, Tokugawa Shogun-Ota Dokan, and the list went on and on. My question was: *Could I bring my camera?* I settled on three people that I think could help my photographic vision: Alfred Stieglitz, Richard Avedon, and Georgia O'Keeffe.

What is one piece of advice you would like to offer to others on following their bliss in photography?

There is no right and wrong. There is only the quest to create beauty and meaningful images. Hopefully, the more you do, the better they get. It is like my daughter in doing

barrel races. What counts is she is learning with every race that she rides. I learn something every day I shoot!


