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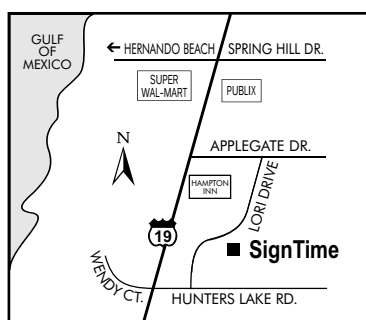

From the Golf Course - Messages From Management

Many of you may or may not know the many tasks that are required to maintain a golf course at a high quality. Aerification, verticutting, topdressing, premerge and post emerge herbicide applications along with basic fertilization. It is ValleyCrest Companies, Inc.'s objective to provide the best possible product to our customers.

Unfortunately on Tuesday, March 16th some of you were awakened by our mowers that were out well before 6:00 a.m. This has happened in the past but is not a regular occurrence. This particular mower has a special attachment that allows us to lightly vertically cut the greens. We are fortunate to have this particular attachment at Heritage Pines as it is advantageous to the growth of our greens and more importantly necessary for the transition of our greens from winter grass to summer grass or our base grass that is Bermuda. Unfortunately we have only one set of these attachments. The time limit to mow 18 greens is approximately two hours with two mowers.

In order to meet an eight-o'clock shot gun start. It is necessary to start at this hour. Again this is not a daily requirement for maintenance, but a periodic necessity for keeping our greens at a high level of quality. It is our hopes that in the future an additional attachment could be purchased to eliminate the inconvenience of being awakened at a time that is even too early for early birds.

2010 Census

The requirement to take the census every 10 years was established in our Constitution with the first one conducted in 1790 under Thomas Jefferson, then Secretary of State. In recent years the census has been conducted by the U. S. Census Bureau, an entity within the Department of Commerce. Its aim is to count every person in the country and where they lived on April 1.

Your census form was mailed to you in mid-March and should have been returned by April 1. If the form was returned, no decentennial census employee will contact you. If you have not returned this ten question form, a representative with an I.D. badge will arrive at your home in late April to pick up and help you with its completion if needed. All of these employees have been background checked and are sworn to keep confidential all information. No identifying information is released to any person or other governmental entity until 72 years has passed.

The information gathered during the decentennial census is released in statistical form and is used to determine representation in the U.S. Congress, state funding for roads, funding for schools and numerous other areas that enhance our quality of life.

Each household that does not return their form costs the government approximately \$65-\$75 to collect when going door to door. Be sure to mail yours!

The function of the task groups are to research current topics/issues/projects and provide results/recommendations/findings/feedback to the entire board. Communications:

Earlier this year, the Communication Task Group then comprised of Janice Benedetti, Bob Ferris and Val Page developed an approach to comply with that portion of the Communications Policy that applied to the board. At that time Linda McCann was responsible for maintaining the board's section of the website. Linda is now assigned to the task group replacing Janice who is assigned to two other task groups.

For your information, the approach that the task group developed and adopted is presented below. The policy is presented in regular text followed by the approach in italics.

Policy: The Board of Directors (hereafter known as the Board) will utilize all communication vehicles at its disposal to provide the following information:

Date, time, location and agenda of all Board Meetings of the HOA, as well as Standing Committees, Forums, Special Meetings and Working Groups.

The Board has been compliant with this requirement for Board conducted meetings, forums, workshops, etc. The BOD Committee Guidelines specifies the process to be followed by committees for announcing meetings. In

essence BOD Committees are required to use the same process as the Board.

The following media are being used by the Board to announce meetings: Publications in the newsletter announce time, date, and location; e-mail blasts announce agenda, date, time and location of meetings, forums, workshops, etc. Signs posted outside the Clubhouse announce date, time and place of Board Meetings. The Bulletin Board posts the date and location of Board Meetings.

Policy: Communicate to the homeowners that all meetings allow time for homeowner input, as described in the meeting agenda guidelines.

The Board is compliant with this policy except for Board Workshops. Generally speaking, comments are not allowed at workshops either before or during the workshop. Comments on workshops can be made at subsequent Resident Forums and, if on the agenda, at Board Meetings.

Board Meetings allow comments on items via a sign-up process with comments limited to three minutes. The announcements notifying residents of meetings include a description of the sign-up process.

Resident Forums are conducted in free format where residents are permitted to have dialogues with the attending board members and GM.

Policy: Develop a set of standard procedures for homeowner verbal and written input, while attending meetings, or as a response to items under consideration or of any other matter of interest to the resident.

Processes are established for verbal inputs at Board Meetings and Resident Forums. There are no protocols in place for written input at either of these meetings.

A protocol was established a few years ago that identified the Board Secretary as the focal point for inputs from residents. The Secretary, in turn, has the authority to forward the input to the appropriate Board member for action.

Policy: Develop a regular written broadcast, which will keep homeowners up to date on recent actions of the Board and its Standing and Ad Hoc Committees and Operating Support Teams as well as issues discussed at Special meetings and Forums or in Working Groups.

Recently, newsletter articles have been published describing Board Actions. That practice will continue. Committees have been publishing articles in the newsletter.

Policy: Provide clarity, visibility and transparency to homeowners regarding new and old issues that have come before the board and a rationale, where possible, as to the decision making process that occurred prior to the vote.

Following Board Meetings, the board will distribute via emails, newsletter articles and the bulletin board, a summary of what transpired at Board Meetings including the pros and cons if applicable of items that were presented for vote.

Policy: Develop a system of Board Forums, Special Meetings and/or Focus Groups that will address current and future issues that have been or will be studied and voted upon, requesting homeowner suggestions and input. Communicate fully the standards and procedures for homeowner input to these issues.

Resident Forums are currently in place to allow resident input. These forums are now scheduled two days before the regularly scheduled Board Meeting allowing residents to have up-to-date agendas. These forums are free format where residents can discuss any issues with the attending board members.

Policy: Provide an annual overview of all actions made by the Board.

The State of the Association Address presented at the Annual Meeting includes an overview of actions made by the board throughout the year.

Policy: The Board of Directors and the General Manager will continually review new methods of communication and technology which will enhance the communication process with homeowners, including weekly emails, homeowner and marketing website utilization, monthly newsletters and periodic Board, Committee and Operating Committee reports.

This is an ongoing task that the board and management have undertaken. New technology is continually being explored for possible application to enhance the communication process.

Policy: Within the Association, the President of the Board will be the official spokesperson regarding policy issues and the General Manager will be the official spokesperson regarding operational issues.

Self-explanatory.

Environmental Issues Committee

On March 9 about twenty-five residents, including members of the Architectural Review and Environmental Issues Committees, attended a workshop presented by Chris Dewey from the Pasco County Extension Office. Chris works with communities like ours to help us learn how to reduce water usage in our landscaping and how to utilize Florida Friendly Landscaping Practices. He was very informative and even made us laugh about some of the issues we are all concerned about. Here are some interesting comments he made during the 2 ½ hour workshop.

Florida is considered to be a “desert with rain.” The state averages about 55”/year.

When applying fertilizer, check with the contractor to be sure that the phosphorus level is 0% or at least very low. Phosphorus is plentiful in our soil which is evident by the fact that it is mined in Florida.

If you want to improve the chances of growing healthy plants in your yard, get your soil tested. Soil testing kits are available from the county extension office and are inexpensive.

Ask your landscape management contractor if he/she is certified in “Green Industries Best Management Practices.” This will help ensure that your landscaping is being cared for in environmentally appropriate ways.

By the year 2013, every company that applies insecticide/fertilizer to our lawns must be certified by the state in the same program as listed above. That includes every employee!

Try this bio-control approach to eliminating harmful insects on your landscaping bushes, shrubs, plants. Mix two tablespoons of vegetable oil and two tablespoons of baby shampoo in one gallon of water. Spray on plants. Much healthier for plants, animals, and humans.

Have your sprinklers checked regularly to ensure that water is going on your lawn and plants and not on the sidewalk or street. During this rainy winter, turn your sprinklers off when rain is imminent.
