

#### **Board of Supervisors Report to Residents**

At the boarding meeting in September 2011, we approved the budget for the fiscal year ending September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2012. As you noticed in your 2011 Real Estate Tax Statement the Heritage Pines CDD lowered oue taxes for the 2011 year to \$349.15. We are pleased to report that this is the third consecutive year we have lowered district taxes.

In addition, we would like to report the following progress over the course of this year:

- 1. The lake on Hole #18 was stocked with Tilapia, a fish helpful in controlling midge/mosquito infestation.
- 2. With the cooperation of the homeowners association, the lakes with fountains were stocked with Tripod carp, a fish that will eat algae and keep fountains from clogging
- 3. Sod repair was done adjacent to the Hole #11 green as well as adjacent to Hole #3 green
- 4. NWRA 38, the nature area between Hole #16 and Hold #17 was treated for control of aquatic weeds.
- 5. The CDD has been planting around wet retention areas in our community to help alleviate erosion. These plantings will continue in the current budget year.

Further, a contract has been executed with a landscape company owned by two Master Gardeners specializing in Florida native plants. They will plant a demo area featuring allowable plantings in our retention areas. This will begin in the spring of 2012 and will be located near the southeast corner of the intersection of Grand Club Drive and Scenic Hills Blvd in EDRA 44A

#### Environmental Issues Committee

#### New Gazebo Park Brick Program

We have found a new vendor for the Gazebo Park bricks. Some of the bricks previously purchased by residents have become "color damaged." Our maintenance department and the Environmental Issues Committee (EIC) believe this is due to pesticide spraying and reclaimed water usage. Additionally, it appears that some bricks were not sealed properly or not sealed at all. The new program will have two components: new bricks and replacement of color-damaged bricks for those residents who want their bricks replaced. New bricks may be purchased now for \$25. Forms are available at the Front Desk. The EIC is working on the plan for the replacement bricks. Details will be in the January newsletter.

Many of you joined us October 27 for the Environmental Fall Fest. We hope you had fun and learned something new, too. Tony Gilboy from SWFWMD explained why sinkholes are so prevalent in our area. Chris Dewey from the Pasco County Extension Office talked about seasonal planting. Jennifer Seney, Pasco County Recycling Coordinator, explained what can go in the blue bags for recycling. She emphasized that recycling programs are based on local needs and concerns. Of course, almost everything is recyclable but we must stick to the requirements for Pasco County. Did you know that not all #1 and #2 plastics can go in blue bags? Stick to the items that have a "neck" like milk, juice, detergent, etc. Plastic clamshells (fruit containers) and black frozen entrée containers may have #1 or #2 on the bottom but they cannot be collected by Pasco County. Not recycling yet? What are you waiting for? Include #1 and #2 plastics as described above, metal food cans, and glass. Pick up is Monday. Place your blue bag right next to your garbage can. Let's be good stewards of the Earth by taking a little time to fill those blue bags.

#### Heres what vou'll need:

- 4 large eggs
- 2 cups of sugar
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1 can (16 ounce) pumpkin puree
- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ teaspoon ground cloves



#### **Instructions:**

Combine and beat the eggs, sugar, vegetable oil, and pumpkin puree in a large bowl until smooth. Stir in remaining ingredients.

Spread the mixture into a 15"x10" pan and baked at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until the surface is a light golden brown color.

Cool completely. Frost with a cream cheese frosting (store bought is best). Sprinkle with crushed walnuts, cut, and serve



#### Ask The Techie

Q: I have recently purchased a new computer and need your advice on what to do with my old computer. Is it safe to donate or should I throw it away?

A: Your first decision is whether to recycle or donate your old computer. If your computer is not operational, I suggest removing the hard drive from the case and either drilling several holes in the drive body using the largest drill bit available. Another option which I enjoy is to whack the hard drive several times with a hammer. Either of these methods should render the hard drive unusable. Remember that the computer contains toxic metals and should not disposed of in the trash. It should be taken to a recycling center for proper disposal.

If you want to donate your computer to a school or other charitable organization, make certain that any personal files, documents, photos etc. are removed from the computer. Note that deleting a file does not completed remove it from the hard drive even if you empty the **Windows Recycle Bin**. Documents, stored passwords and other personal information can be recovered using readily technical tools.

When I prepare a computer for donation, I create a new Login User via the **Control Panel** and delete ALL of the old Login users including their files. I then install a free space eraser tool to overwrite the unused hard drive space. An easy to use tool for this purpose is called **ERASER**. Do a Google search for "**free disk space eraser**" to find this tool and others available for download and installation. Depending on the size of your hard drive the space erase process can take several hours to complete.

# Q: The screen on my new high definition TV is very bright. Is there a setting that can be changed to reduce the screen brightness and intensity of the colors?

A: The screen display for your TV is probably set on the STORE or DEMO setting. This setting is intended for use in the brightly lit environment of a retail store and is meant to attract your attention and showcase the sets vibrant colors. To change this setting check if your remote has a button labeled VIDEO, MODE OR DISPLAY (depending on your TV model). Additional settings may include STANDARD, DYNAMIC, THEATRE, GAME, etc. Try the various setting until you find the best available for viewing in your home environment. You may want to experiment changing this setting when watching non-HD or other content such as DVD movies.

If your remote doesn't have a dedicated VIDEO button, press the MENU or SETTINGS button on your remote and search for the SCREEN or DISPLAY setting menu.




#### **Golf Programs**



#### Kitty Coalition

We love our pets here in Heritage Pines. Every day, HP residents can be seen walking their dogs or giving them rides in the golf cart. Cats are equally as revered by being honored on the 'big screen' at the Acatemy Awards. Proud pet owners submit their pet for the Pet Lovers' "Pet of the Month" article. No doubt about it, pets are very important to us, and most are like family members.

But have you given any thought to, or made arrangements for, what will happen to your beloved pet if you should become incapacitated, go to a nursing home, or even die? Especially in these economic times, the county shelters are already spilling over with animals. They will euthanize animals who are not immediately adopted, and you don't want to ever see this mass death process. If this fate for your pet bothers you – then you MUST make plans now. Think about it. Is there a chance that your pet will outlive you? Accidents happen every day.

First, be sure to post a window sticker for emergencies that state how many pets are in your home. In case of fire, rescuers will know to look for a dog or cat. Here in HP, the Pet Lover's Club encourages a brief pet registration and photo of your pet so that he or she can be identified if lost or found. It is not a county or legal registration, but simply a way for neighbors to help if your pet becomes lost. Registration forms are found on our website and at the Front Desk.

Next, tell your children or relatives that the Pasco or other county facility is NOT an option. Try to find a relative or friend who will agree to take your pet if anything happens to you. If all else fails, a no-kill shelter might be an option, but they are also full, so they often only accept easy-to-adopt animals.

Also, consider a financial arrangement to help care for your pet, particularly if your baby will be going to a non-relative. Your attorney can assist you with the important features of such a trust, to include instructions for your pet's burial, standard of care, etc. Be sure to place this document where it can be easily and quickly found, in addition to informing your

children and/or friends of the provision.

Yes, we love our pets because they provide companionship and love.....but we must make sure we think beyond the present. Your baby will miss you terribly, but insuring for its comfort after you're gone is the greatest measure of love you can offer.





#### **Feanut Butter Dog Treats**

Ingredients: Water, butter, powdered milk, salt, sugar, flour, egg, peanut butter, oats, honey.

Boil or microwave ½ cup water and 1 stick of butter. In a mixing bowl put above ingredients, and ½ cup powdered milk, 1 tsp of salt, 2 tsp sugar and 3 cups of flour (whole wheat or regular). Beat 1 egg and add to mixture. Add half jar of peanut butter (1 lb. 12 oz.), 1 cup of mother's oats and 2 Tbsp honey (optional). Mix, then knead till stiff dough. You may have to add a little flour. Roll out and use cookie cutters. Place on nonstick pan and cook at 350 for 18 minutes (9 per side). Cool on wax paper. Enjoy.
