

FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

It's another great morning in Heritage Pines. The recent rains have had a very positive impact on the beauty of our community. Everything is so green and colorful. Finally after all the work put into the golf course, it is finally paying off. The fairways are in good shape and work has commenced on four of the tee boxes. A decision is pending on how to improve the rough and may have in fact been reached before you read this article. At the end of May we are still ahead of our budget projections and continue to expect to end the year with a balanced budget. We have the potential for a couple of substantial outside events in late summer and early fall which could have positive impact on our revenues. We sent out a message from the board last month addressing some of the issues and recent e-mails questioning our financial condition. Thanks for the e-mails that you sent to the board and General Manager expressing your thoughts. An overwhelming number of these e-mails were positive in nature. As you can see from the May 2017 financials, our operating net is a positive \$78,304 so we are tracking pretty close to our budget. One of the key indicators that we look at is the ratio between food and beverage revenues which for this year through May is \$1.24. Simply that means that we spend \$1.24 for every dollar that is generated as revenue. Since 2010, HPCA's revenue to expense ratio has averaged around \$1.24. According to most of the industry reports on private clubs similar to Heritage Pines, the Florida average is \$1.40. So we are doing better than average. During the period 2010-2016 our Food and Beverage has lost money every year. Since 2011 our golf program has experienced losses of over \$200,000 each year. The revenue to expense ratio has been steady at about \$1.24. In fact, our Food and Beverage ratio for the Month of May 2017 was \$1.17 and for the first five months of 2017, \$1.23. By in large we stack up well against equivalent clubs.

FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

There is a great deal going on in our community right now as we take advantage of the summer heat and start to get our afternoon showers which stimulate plant growth. Work on the four tee boxes has gone extremely well and hopefully later this month they will be grown in and back in

play. We are also finalizing a plan to remove certain areas of rough throughout the golf course to improve the turf conditions that have been a problem for such a long time. There will be no disruption in play as the work will be done along the edges of the fairway.

The Ad Hoc Common Grounds Committee has been busy and met with different contractors last month to get ideas and bids for Phase 2 of the Landscaping Project. This project will upgrade the medians on Grand Club Drive from the gate to Scenic Hills. This is a much different project than the front entrance as these upgrades will be dealing mostly with just the plants and design on the tips of the medians. Once the committee has chosen a design and a contractor they will submit their choices to the Board for approval.

There has been a great deal of conversation through the years concerning the lack of lighting on the roads in some areas of our community and the impact that it has on the safety and security of our residents. The CDD Board has come forward with a plan that would make great strides in solving these problems. These discussions have just started and there will be more emails sent out to all residents with more details in the next couple of months.

FROM THE ACCOUNTING DEPARTMENT

2017 HOA Fees

The monthly assessment amount is \$185 per month for Heritage Pines Community Association. Many of the village assessments have changed as well. Please check with your village manager if you have any questions on that amount. You **do not** have to do anything to change monthly automatic debit amount if you are set up for ACH. It will be processed at the new amount.

ACH and Online/Email Services

If you are not set up for automatic debit (ACH), please consider this simple process. It's easy to set up and you don't have to worry about anything except deducting the amount from your checking balance each month. And in case you did not know, we never deduct your HOA fee before the

third each month. We had many requests to hold off until the third from members that don't receive their direct deposits until then. Also please consider doing away with paper statements. You can view online or have emailed. Just request an "Opt out of paper statement form" from the office, fill out and return with your email address.

Out of Town Mail Service

Recently it was brought to our attention that some mail does not get forwarded if the name on your account is something different, like a trust for example. If you are going out of town for an extended period of time, please let us know in the office. We can set your mail to go to another address so you don't miss important association mailings. Just remember to give us a call or email to change it back when you return home.

Member Charge (Jonas) System

We always ask that you bring your member charge card to the club for purchases. This just helps prevent charge errors. If you do not have your card, please do not sign your charge until you have verified it has correct member information at the top. Also as mentioned before, our Jonas system separates your HOA fees and club charges, so we need to have them paid separately. We appreciate that most monthly accounts are current and if not it is usually a one time over sight and we take that into consideration. Please keep in mind club charges not paid by the 20th of the following month can be assessed a \$25 late fee as well as HOA fees not paid in the month they are due for.

Overall Food Cost for the month of May is 49% with the year to date costs of 43%. Alcohol costs for May is 34% with year to date of 34%. The Alcohol Inventory Adjustment of \$1,205 for May of 2017 breaks down as: Beer (\$26), Wine \$235 and Liquor \$996.

Accounts Receivable (AR) at 05/31/2017: Club AR of \$80,339 is \$79,119 current and \$1,220 is 30 – 120 days. HOA AR at 05/31/2017 of \$48,377 includes four liens/foreclosures totaling \$35,378, 30 – 60 days of \$9,429 and \$3,570 in AR fines.

To date there still is no Pasco County Reclaimed Water billing received. No amount has been accrued in 2017 and expenses are under budget by \$12,057 in that line item for April and \$39,420 for the year to date.

Recent water restrictions have required use of the newly repair augmentation well for the golf course and common ground. GL 8110 over budget by \$12,057 in that line item for May and \$39,420 year to date.

FTE's remain at 66 compared to the budget of 73.

GOLF COURSE AND COMMON GROUNDS MAINTENANCE NEWS

Summer is finally here at Heritage Pines and so is the rainfall. Hope you have been able to dodge the drops thus far. The Golf Course has received water only twice from Pasco County since being restricted on March 26th. Our ground wells continue to be operated as needed to supply enough water for the Course and Common Grounds. Depending on rainfall volume we anticipate restrictions at least through July. We will keep you posted. The recent rainfall has done wonders for overall plant health here at HP. Rain provides superior quality moisture that is free of high levels of sodium and bicarbonates that we routinely utilize via our reclaimed source. The use of our ground wells also provides better quality water that is more conducive to plant growth. Weed and insect spraying continues throughout the facility. Fertilizers have also been applied recently to enhance both turf and plant growth and help to minimize insect and weed damage. The final phase of our tee renovation commenced on June 12. Tees 4, 8, 10 and 14 will be renovated. This



process includes expanding the tee surface area, reshaping as necessary, laser leveling and re-grassing. Projected re-opening date is scheduled for July 15th.

Phase 2 of our Common Grounds Landscape project is underway. This current phase incorporates the renovation of the center islands from the Guard House to the Clubhouse via Grand Club Drive and Scenic Hills Boulevard. A total of eight islands have been slated for renovation.

To commemorate our initial entry way renovation, the featured plant this month is the Agapanthus. This is one of our most colorful features in the vicinity of the guard house. Agapanthus are very colorful and exhibit round shaped, bright blue flowers during the summer months. The plant itself is very leathery. Leaves are arranged in opposite rows. These plants are cold hardy and will regenerate after a cold winter. They are also pest free and reclaimed water tolerant. Be sure to check them out on your next trip through the front gate.

When temperatures rise into the '80s and '90s and combined with high humidity, it is enough to wilt even the most enthusiastic sun worshiper. The resulting "feels like" temperature puts older adults in particular at risk because aging reduces the body's ability to cool off. However, it's important to note that heat stress can occur at any age and is a serious concern. That's why it's important to know the signs and symptoms of heat stress and how to seek treatment.

Here are some common sense and fun ways to beat the Florida heat:

- Water. Drink plenty of it... even if you are not thirsty. You want to drink enough water to avoid getting thirsty. It's important to stay hydrated.
- Carry a refillable water bottle. Saving money on purchasing bottled water may encourage you to drink more.

- Dress appropriately. Dress in light-weight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing. Cotton fabric is suggested.
- Wear a hat or carry an umbrella. Blocking the sun's harmful rays will reduce your chances of sunburn, AND make you feel cooler.
- Wearing a hat or carrying an umbrella does NOT mean that you skip on applying sunscreen!
- Avoid midday heat. The sun is the hottest between noon and 4:00 p.m. This is a good time to have lunch, nap, go to a movie, or go shopping indoors.
- Follow these tips to help you stay cool at Disney World that includes specific areas in each park where you can find relief from the heat.
- Limit vigorous activity. Limiting vigorous activity during the hottest part of the day is advised.
- Do use "keep your cool" gadgets. Whether it is a spray bottle to mist your face, a small personal fan, an umbrella hat, or a thermal-cool neck wrap – they do help!
- Apply cold water to your body's quick cooling spots (back of wrists, neck, elbows and knees).
- Make your own refreshing cool spray by adding peppermint tea to your spray bottle (the menthol in the tea will give your skin a cool feeling).
- Aloe Vera not only soothes sunburns. Sprays made with it and peppermint oil and witch hazel cool better than just water (there are all kinds of recipes to be found online).
- Seek air conditioning. If the temperature is above 90 degrees, fans alone often cannot protect you against heat-related illness.
- Take a day off from the sun and visit one of these cool indoor places or take in a movie or spend the afternoon shopping at a mall.
- Eat light. Avoid heavy foods and opt for foods high in water content – fruits, salads, and soups.
- Freeze a baggie full of grapes for a refreshing treat.
- Take baths and showers. Water conducts heat away from the body, so taking frequent tepid baths or showers is a good cooling technique.
- Utilize those showers at the beach for more than rinsing the sand off your feet.
- Seek out "green" spaces. Find a garden or any patch of green. Ideally, head for one with some trees for shade. Trees block the sun and actually act as living air conditioners.
- Enjoy water play. Whether it is the ocean, your hotel pool, a water park, or an interactive splash fountain... enjoy playing in the water wherever you are.
- Inexpensive water guns can be a fun way to stay cool on a hot day.

To everyone in Heritage Pines Community, just remember to please watch your SPEED as we are driving in the community. It's not only for everyone's safety but your own. Also please use the STOP signs; they're there for your safety and others!



COUNCIL OF VILLAGES

Rosie Tilton opened the meeting at 4:00 in the PAC room. She introduced Mike Miller, Chair of the ACC (Architectural Control Committee) to discuss several changes in the manual and handed out printed copies of the ACC manual with the changes. An amendment on May 22, 2017 (see p. 16 para. 4.8 Driveways and Walkways) changed the width of the driveway

allowance. Previously the requirement was that the driveway could be the width of the garage door opening. Now the driveway can be the width of the garage itself. In section 4.8.1 Driveway and Walkway Pavers, the wording was changed to comply with the change to the width of the driveway. There was discussion about villa driveway pavers and that issue must be approved by the village ACC. He then addressed Section 5.2.1 Trees and Shrubs, part of which states that trees must be planted at least 5' from the front and rear property line and 5' from the side property line. At least two trees on the property must be from the approved Pasco County list or by checking on the Florida Friendly website. The community requires a minimum of two trees, one in the front and one in the rear. He went over the need to use the latest version ACR (Architectural Control Request) printed each month in the Pines and available at the front desk – and completely fill in each blank when making exterior changes. If required information is left off, or blanks are not filled in, the ACR will not be approved. In some cases a permit from Pasco County is required to remove a tree and the contractor will supply the permit. ACC approval is required also. There was discussion about requirements on corner lots. Exhibit E in the manual lists approved trees and at the bottom it says “additional trees can be found on the Florida Friendly Website. A resident wants to remove large hedges originally planted by the builder and asked if that needed an ACC approval. Mike stated that any major change to the exterior of your home or yard requires an ACR. He then addressed section 5.2.6 Florida Friendly Landscaping. There are some difference between us and the County regarding landscape area vs. lawn area. We want 75% of the area available for grass. He stated that if you want something different than what is in the manual, submit a request for it to be considered.

Rosie then introduced Marge Warren and Tom Cegla from CERT. They spoke last month and this is a return visit to follow up on their request to obtain a name for a contact person in each village that would be responsible for knowing which resident(s) in their village would need help in the case of an emergency.

A form was passed for this purpose. Time requirement is one hour per month. If there is no designated person today for your village, please e-mail the information – when gathered – to either Marge or Tom.

COUNCIL OF VILLAGES cont'd

Rosie moved on to the questions submitted by residents. She apologized for the brevity of the answers because she learned only two hours prior to this meeting that Bill would not be able to attend because of a personal emergency and none of the members of the BoD were available. The choice was to cancel the meeting or go on as scheduled. The brief answers given to her will hopefully be supplemented by the Village reps and attendees.

1. Can hurricane shutters be put up before snowbirds head north? No. Ref 4.6 of the ACC Manual p. 16 Storm shutters may be closed only upon issuance of an official storm watch and must be returned to the open position . . . within 72 hours following the lifting of said hurricane watch.

2. I have noticed motorcycles entering and leaving HP bypassing the car reader and going around the yellow arm. How do we know that these cyclists live here in HP? Rosie felt that the intent of the question was misunderstood. The question was asked for security purposes, not a negative comment about motorcyclists. It turns out there is a HP motorcycle sticker; however there is no place it can be placed on a bike that the reader can read it. Therefore the motorcycle must go around the gate to gain entrance. It was suggested they could use the guest gate.

3. The Daily Group has been parking a truck and two trailers in the parking lot by the driving range for several months. What is the arrangement with this company for the parking of their vehicles and why have they been given such extended parking privileges? Are all vendors being afforded the same courtesy? It would appear that a more appropriate place for the parking of these vehicles would be over by the RV parking area (maintenance area). They are now gone. They were in the community painting 109 homes. A rep noted that the trailer held excess paint/supplies and was being used as a staging platform. The question remains why do they not park by the maintenance shed?

4. The roof of the cupola on the gazebo, which overlooks the pond on hole 18, collapsed several months ago. It has not been replaced. What is the schedule for its replacement? A piece of plywood was put across the opening. There are major structural problems with the gazebo. If we cannot find a replacement cupola, the structure is slated for a rebuild next year as a reserve project.

5. The reclaimed irrigation system recently issued a change whereby there is no water provided except during the hours of darkness. There is no way to check our sprinklers for malfunctions. Just wondering if there'll be a change to have water available from time to time during daylight hours to check the systems. The pumps are on from 8 a.m. until 10 a.m. for repairs. If dry weather continues, this could stop. It was volunteered that your vendor can contact Pasco County and they will tell you when the water will be on. A rep volunteered that after calling the county they told her they were running out of recycled water. Also, the golf course has switched over to well water. The rain this week should help the situation.

6. On hole #9 an expensive tree which is on the golf course was moved about 20' by Ventura rather than HP grounds crew. I believe this is a memorial tree. Why was it moved? Did Ventura move it instead of our grounds crew because they will replace it if it dies? If not, why did they move it and not John's workers? The tree was moved by Ventura because it was blocking irrigation on the golf course. After checking it was found this memorial tree had no family to contact. Ventura had better equipment to do the job properly. There was no damage to the tree and the cost was \$200.

FYI - Rosie received an advertisement from Silverthorn Golf Course which she wanted to pass on to the GM. It claims \$45/yr + \$10 admin fee which appears to be all you pay. The truth is it costs \$177 for 3 yrs + \$18+tax for each round of golf.

The goal was to end this meeting with a positive view of HP. Bob Johnson (Tall Pines Village) has brought us a gift – a beautiful CD titled “The Beauty of Heritage Pines” – in living color and sound. Bob loves drones and we are benefitting from his expertise and talent using both a drone and a camera. You have to see it to believe it. This is one of the perks of attending Council of Villages meetings.

There is no meeting in July and the next meeting is scheduled for August 10. Rosie expressed her frustration with chairing these meetings and wondered out loud if they can continue.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

The first Architectural Control Committee (ACC) meeting for July has been moved to Wednesday, July 5th due to the holiday on the 4th. The balance of the meetings scheduled for 2017 remain unchanged at this time.

The ACC Manual covering Driveway and Walkways (Section 4.8) and Driveway and Walkway Pavers (Section 4.8.1) was amended on May 22, 2017. Several requests were received to allow the width of the driveway to be increased from the “current concrete garage door opening” to “current concrete width of the garage”. This May 22nd amendment allows the increase in width of the driveway.

We recommend that the homeowner read the entire section prior to submitting an Exterior Change Request (ECR), especially if you intend to expand the width of a new driveway, whether it be poured concrete or pavers.

The committee reviews all requests to make changes to the ACC Manual, we are here to serve the community at the pleasure of the BOD. Thank You

GOLF HANDICAP COMMITTEE

By Joy Stefany, *Handicap Chair*

Understanding the GHIN Handicap System and it's codes – is the theme for this month's report.

GHIN is the handicap calculation service used by Heritage Pines. It is approved by the USGA and is tied to the Tournament Pairing Program used by our leagues for golfing events. The Handicap Index HI is sometimes shown with a letter after the number.

- N = 9-Hole HI
- L = Local (used when the HI is higher than USGA allows)
- R = HI Reduced (GHIN does this as a result of low T/Tournament scores)
- M = Modified (HI modified temporarily by Handicap committee)

Scores are shown with letters that indicate the type of score posted

- H = Home
- T = Tournament
- P = Penalty
- A = Away
- C = Combined

To determine your course handicap, go to GHIN.com and enter your GHIN number. Click on C.H. calc. Your H.I. appears. Enter the slope for the tees that you want – and your C.H. will appear. Please note that this C.H. may not be the same as on your GHIN card. Heritage Pines does not have a designated tee and the GHIN system uses the average slope of 113.



STRETCHING: FOCUS ON FLEXIBILITY

You can stretch anytime, anywhere. Just follow these tips to do it safely and effectively.

Stretching may take a back seat to your exercise routine. The main concern is exercising, not stretching, right?

Not so fast. Stretching may help you:

- Improve your joint range of motion
- Improve your athletic performance
- Decrease your risk of injury

Understand why stretching can help and how to stretch correctly.

Benefits of Stretching

Studies about the benefits of stretching have had mixed results. Some show that stretching helps. Other studies show that stretching before or after exercise has little to no benefit.

Some research shows that stretching doesn't reduce muscle soreness after exercise, and other studies show that static

stretching performed immediately before a sprint event may slightly worsen performance.

Stretching can help improve flexibility, and, consequently, range of motion about your joints. Better flexibility may:

- Improve your performance in physical activities
- Decrease your risk of injuries
- Help your joints move through their full range of motion
- Enable your muscles to work most effectively

Stretching also increases blood flow to the muscle. You may learn to enjoy the ritual of stretching before or after hitting the trail, ballet floor or soccer field.

Stretching Essentials

Before you plunge into stretching, make sure you do it safely and effectively. While you can stretch anytime, anywhere, be sure to use proper technique. Stretching incorrectly can actually do more harm than good.

Use these tips to keep stretching safe:

- **Don't consider stretching a warmup.** You may hurt yourself if you stretch cold muscles. Before stretching, warm up with light walking, jogging or biking at low intensity for five to ten minutes. Even better, stretch after your workout when your muscles are warm.

Consider skipping stretching before an intense activity, such as sprinting or track and field activities. Some research suggests that pre-event stretching may actually decrease performance. Research has also shown that stretching immediately before an event weakens hamstring strength.

Instead of static stretching, try performing a "dynamic warmup." A dynamic warm-up involves performing movements similar to those in your sport or physical activity at a low level, then gradually increasing the speed and intensity as you warm up.

- **Strive for symmetry.** Everyone's genetics for flexibility are a bit different. Rather than striving for the flexibility of a dancer or gymnast, focus on having equal flexibility side to side (especially if you have a history of a previous injury). Flexibility that is not equal on both sides may be a risk factor for injury.
- **Focus on major muscle groups.** Concentrate your stretches on major muscle groups such as your calves, thighs, hips, lower back, neck and shoulders. Make sure that you stretch both sides.
- **Also stretch muscles and joints that you routinely use.**
- **Don't bounce.** Stretch in a smooth movement, without bouncing. Bouncing as you stretch can injure your muscle and actually contribute to muscle tightness.
- **Hold your stretch.** Breathe normally and hold each stretch for about 30 seconds; in problem areas, you may need to hold for around 60 seconds.
- **Don't aim for pain.** Expect to feel tension while you're stretching, not pain. If it hurts, you've pushed too far. Back off

to the point where you don't feel any pain, then hold the stretch.

- Make stretches sport specific. Some evidence suggests that it's helpful to do stretches involving the muscles used most in your sport or activity. If you play soccer, for instance, stretch your hamstrings as you're more vulnerable to hamstring strains. So opt for stretches that help your hamstrings.
- Keep up with your stretching. Stretching can be time-consuming. But you can achieve the most benefits by stretching regularly, at least two to three times a week.
- Skipping regular stretching means you risk losing the potential benefits. For instance, if stretching helped you increase your range of motion, your range of motion may decrease again if you stop stretching.
- Bring movement into your stretching. Gentle movements, such as those in tai chi or yoga, can help you be more flexible in specific movements. These types of exercises can also help reduce falls in seniors.

Remember the "dynamic warmup:" If you're going to perform a specific activity, such as a kick in martial arts or kicking a soccer ball, start out slowly and at low intensity to get your muscles used to it. Then speed up gradually.

Know when to exercise caution.

You might need to approach stretching with caution. If you have a chronic condition or an injury, you might need to adjust your stretching techniques. For example, if you already have a strained muscle, stretching it may cause further harm.

Remember that stretching doesn't mean you can't get injured. Stretching, for instance, won't prevent an overuse injury. Talk to your doctor or physical therapist about the most appropriate way to stretch if you have any health concerns.

ASK THE TECHIE



Q: I am connecting a Wireless Router to my home network so I can use my laptop from anywhere in my home. It was easy to connect and seems to be working fine. However, a neighbor suggests I enable security. What does this mean and why is it necessary for someone living in Heritage Pines?

A: I highly recommend enabling wireless security. Even though we live in a secure community, we are vulnerable to outside parties accessing our computers and laptops remotely. There are free programs available on the Internet that may enable someone to record your Internet activity possibly learning your login names and passwords.

In addition, if your network is unsecure a neighbor or anyone with a wireless antenna can access your Internet connection without your knowledge. There was a recent case, in New York, where an unsuspecting individual was visited by the police who traced a pedophile to their Internet connection. The shocked individual was proven innocent and the pedophile was eventually captured. It was determined that the pedophile was using the unsecure connection from a quarter of a mile away.

To secure your wireless connection, follow the manufacturer instructions to enable Wireless Security and select a Security Key. This key should be something other than your email or other passwords. It is used the first time you connect wirelessly and recorded. You will need to provide this key to any visitors with laptops, smartphones, iPads or other Wi-Fi devices. If you have Frontier FIOS, Wireless Security is already enabled and the Security Key is printed on the bottom of the modem/router.

Q: Whenever I close my laptop as I move to a different location in my home the computer turns off requiring me to power it back on. This is very annoying and I would prefer that it not do this. Can I change a setting to stop this?

A: Yes, you can easily change the setting that is causing your computer to go to sleep when you close the lid. The setting you want to change is found in the **Control Panel | System Settings** in the **Power Options** Section. Change the "Choose what closing the lid does" setting to **DO NOTHING** for both the **ON BATTERY** and **PLUGGED IN** choices.

While in the **POWER OPTIONS** section you may also want to review and possibly adjust the **POWER BUTTON, DISPLAY** and **PUT THE COMPUTER TO SLEEP** settings. These settings are usually set to optimize battery life and may not be convenient for your situation.

This time frame is tentative of course based on the weather patterns we will be experiencing during the month. More rain equals more delay in starting the project.



2017 National Genealogical Conference

I love genealogy! To be able to look into the past and see how my ancestors lived is a gift! In May of this year, I had the opportunity to attend the National Genealogical Conference in Raleigh, NC and I had an incredible time!

The resources at the National Genealogical Conference are unbelievable! There was an infinite number of classes and informational booths to choose from and visit. One of the classes I want to highlight today was called "Your Portable, Sortable Research Log." This class taught how to use an excel spreadsheet(s) to keep track of discovered information and future research goals. To keep the information accurate and detailed you will need to create the following columns on your spreadsheet: All Sources Searched, Goal of the Search, Negative Results, Date of Search and References.

You can choose to create one spreadsheet for all of your research or create multiples – it is a personal choice. However, in my opinion, one spreadsheet is easier to work with for the following reasons: printed information is easily transportable (less pages = less mess) and using one spreadsheet eliminates the possibility of missing information stored on other sheets. On the other hand, using multiple spreadsheets can be easier to work with because there are less data (on one page) to sort through. As you can see, there are pros and cons to both options, which is why you should choose the option that works best for you and your research! For those of you who do not have Microsoft Excel, FEAR NOT! There are two alternative programs (that I know of) you can use - Google Sheets or Open Office.

TAI CHI CLASSES

Summer Schedule**

Please note the revised schedule above for the summer months. Tuesday will remain the same as a Beginner Class (although it is really more of an Intermediate Class now, since we are more than half way through the form). Thursday morning class will become a combination of the usual Thursday, Advanced Class and the Saturday, Qigong Class. We will also be starting 15 minutes earlier at 8:15, to allow a little more time to fit in Qigong and the Tai Chi form. All are encouraged to attend the Thursday class, regardless of your progress with Tai Chi (or even if you have never attended a Tai Chi class). I promise to make it interesting for all.

Saturday morning classes will be suspended from June 1 to October 1.

What is Tai Chi?

Tai Chi has evolved over hundreds of years from a Chinese martial art into a simple and gentle exercise that has many health benefits for all ages. Tai Chi practice raises chi, or life energy, which strengthens the immune system, improves health, and whole body energy (or jin), also called intrinsic energy, which improves coordination. As practice evolves, feet, legs and pelvis, spine, arms, and hands feel more connected, and the movements of head and body begin to feel coordinated. There comes a time when breathing and movements of all parts of the body follow one rhythm.

Tai Chi movements build energy gradually; generate warmth; and a sense of completeness. After a half hour of practice, you can feel this energy as heat in certain parts of the body (especially the hands). Each posture cultivates a different kind of energy flow. The role of the individual student, in the process, is to try, through tai chi, to create the conditions in which energy can flow and to give the body time to heal itself.

Tai Chi teaches people to become alert to intelligence from within while learning to listen to what is happening outside and to respond to others. When Tai Chi movements are performed correctly, they work to calm and focus the mind, so that mind, energy, and body work in harmony.

Tai Chi is quality movement. It is physically demanding, yet it works with the body to encourage the gradual developing of strength and reviving of natural openness and coordination. The movements of Tai Chi continually turn the spine, an action that gradually repositions misplaced organs, stimulating them at the same time through an internal form of massage. These same movements also dissipate excess nervous tension held in the body and help balance the nervous system. Practicing tai chi encourages the joints to open, that is, to relax completely, thus increasing the mobility in all joints of the body.
