

Weekly Event Payouts

Ideally there are an equal number of players in each flight, but sometimes there are multiple players at the break point so there will more players in one flight than another. For example: Say there are 40 players so the ideal would be to have 10 players in each of four flights, therefore \$20 to pay out (\$2 per player times 10 players per flight). However as it turns out, the break point on this day to try to achieve 10 players in the first flight is at a handicap of 18, but there are 3 people who have an 18 handicap. If there were already 8 people with handicaps below 18, those three additional will cause the first flight to have 11 players and \$22 to pay out (11 players x \$2). Hopefully this explains why there are sometimes variations in the number of people per flight and the money paid out in each flight.

High Country-Barb Domst & Carolyn Gallo

High Country is an organized Interclub summer league consisting of eight (8) clubs in Citrus, Hernando and Pasco Counties. Participating clubs are: Heritage Pines, Seven Rivers, Sugar Mill Woods, Southern Woods, Silverthorn, Glen Lakes, the Dunes, and Hernando Oaks.

The format is a team match play event: One better of Two (net) scores. Two players from each club play against two players of an opposing club. A total of eight (8) Heritage Pines players (plus 2 alternates) are selected from the sign up sheet beginning with the lowest handicap indexes available for that date. Any player from our league can sign up. Everyone plays in at least one match is eligible to play in the Jamboree. Matches are played according to USGA Match Play rules. Is there a Penalty????

Format: individual stroke play (no team or partners)

Q: Three players are on the green and have laid equipment on the side of the green but still on the putting surface..

Player #4 is chipping from off the green and miss hits her shot sending the ball past the hole, the ball is stopped by a club at the edge of the green (still on the putting surface).

A: RULE 19: Ball in Motion Deflected of Stopped

Rule 19-1 By Outside Agency- If a player's ball in motion is accidentally deflected or stopped by any outside agency, (A player in this format is an island onto herself and the other players in the group are outside agencies; just like spectators, maintenance workers, etc. If a ball played from off the green is deflected of stopped by an outside agency (another player, caddie or their equipment), it is the rub of the green and the ball is played as it lies.



Community Emergency Response Team

HERITAGE PINES CERT

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) concept began in 1985 in California after officials realized the citizens trying to rescue others after an earthquake could lose their lives because they reacted through instinct rather than training. The CERT Training Program was developed by the Dept. of Homeland Security and is administered by State and County Emergency Management Agencies.

In most counties CERT members are deployed by the County EOC to disaster areas. Pasco County is testing a different approach by permitting communities like Heritage Pines to establish their own CERT to be prepared to respond in the community. CERT's are trained to put safety first, use specific methods and follow CERT procedures.

Should we be hit by a tornado or hurricane and there are no emergency services (fire and/or ambulance) available after the all clear is given, CERT will activate. Team members will report to predetermined command post and proceed to implement our emergency management plan. Our mission will be to save and sustain life until emergency services become available.

In 2006, 47 Heritage Pines Residents completed 28 hours of CERT training administered by Pasco County Emergency Management Staff. CERT classes cover:

Disasters & Personal Preparedness

Fire Safety

Disaster Medical Operations, triage, first aid, and functions of disaster medical ops

Light Search & Rescue Operations

National Incident Management System

CERT Organization

Disaster Psychology

Terrorism

Since completing the initial training the Heritage Pines CERT has established an Operations Director coordinating four Units, Logistics, Fire/Utilities, Medical and Search & Rescue with a Chief in charge of each Unit. Each unit has specific responsibilities covered by teams, headed up by team leaders. Last year we completed our written Emergency Management Plan, established our predetermined command post location and purchased basic CERT activation materials and equipment.

We have 58 first responders in the Heritage Pines CERT with 41 CERT certified residents, and 17 residents in the process of becoming certified,

If you live in Heritage Pines year around, can walk 1 mile, lift 40 lbs, can attend monthly CERT meetings the last Tuesday each month 4-5 pm, and wish to become part of the Heritage Pines CERT by completing an upcoming CERT class, contact Janet Cahill 819-8789.

Golf Etiquette and Rules: When on the course please remember the following things:

The fences around the sink holes on 1 & 9 are immovable obstructions that may interfere with your stance or swing. You may take a drop within one club length, no near the hole, without penalty. If the ball is in the hazard there is a one stroke penalty.

If you have an unplayable ball in the bunker you may drop it within two club lengths no nearer the hole (staying within the bunker) resulting in a one stroke penalty.

If you believe your ball may have

gone out of bounds, declare so and play a provisional ball. If on finding it in bounds you must play the original shot not the provisional.

It is a good habit to always mark your ball when on the green. A gentle reminder from the Statistical Committee: Please take the time to accurately compute your score for each Tuesday's game and your score for inputting in the GHIN system. If you have not received your laminated Equitable Stroke Play (ESP) Card please make sure to talk to Kathy Butler or Nancy Suter. If you have any questions regarding your score, the Pro Shop will be happy to assist you to make sure what you are entering is correct.

Netiquette

If you receive a nasty email - do not respond immediately - if at all. People are very bold and overly critical on the other side of this screen. They tend to not hesitate to point out the things they think you need improvement on while not even noticing the good or positive points on the very same issue. Many times these folks are simply trying to get a rise out of you (this is called "trolling") or are trying to make themselves feel self-important. If you do not have something nice or constructive to say, or at the very least sternly professional - just hit delete.

Keep in mind that all private email is considered to be copyrighted by the original author. If you post private email to a public list or board, or forward it to an outside party in whole or in part, you must include the author's permission to post the material publicly. Not doing so can get you into some deep doo-doo legally or with your friends and associates. Think of it this way... how would you feel if a personal private email that you had written for a specific purpose/person is then plastered across the Internet or forwarded to folks you do not know? Always ask for permission before forwarding or posting any private emails!

You are what you write. How you communicate will be an indication as to who you are and the kind of person you are. Learn to write with clarity and take folks at their word - not what you "think" they mean.

- Sending email with extremely foul, threatening or abusive language is crude. This includes obscenities, verbal harassment, threats of slander or personal comments that would prove offensive based on race, religion, or sexual orientation.
- No matter how rude someone may be to you, or how offended you may be by another's opinion, don't lower yourself to their level by stooping to obscenities, threats or claims of self-importance. Always state your opinion clearly and concisely, without personalizing an issue or resorting to name-calling. You also want to be very careful to not read anything into an email that isn't there. Take folks at their word. There are many heated discussions online because some will imply what others did not state or mean. Hold your head high and communicate as an adult, share your opinions and point of view and realize, that in the grand scheme of things nobody is "better" than anybody else by virtue of their opinions alone.
- If you have mistakenly offended or have misinterpreted what another person wrote, please do not hesitate to apologize. That being said, "apologies" which are only offered to create an opportunity to

continue a tirade from a previous email are viewed as self-righteous. Apologies should only be offered with sincerity. Certainly, this does not mean you need to apologize to everyone who has a different or overly critical opinion than you do. We are all individuals and for the most part we all do our best to do the right thing. No one person is any better a human being than another because of the luxury of their level of education or how much money they make. No one person is authorized to be the one who is always right or the only one whose opinion counts. There are one too many online who will take the time to point out negatives without mentioning any of the positives or to offer suggestions; all they have to offer is criticism.

Know you have done your best and take constructive criticism in stride. None of us are perfect - nor do I think we would want that responsibility! If you make a mistake, make note and put the appropriate corrections or modifications in place to prevent the same from happening in the future.

This is a good time to keep in mind that you never put anything in an email that you don't want the world to know about. Emails get reported and forwarded to public Newsgroups and message boards and can be produced at a later date. (That is why it is best to watch postings (called lurking) first before posting so you have a feel for the community you will be participating in.) Always be better than that and "agree to disagree" like most adults do. Don't become overly bold just because you feel you are safely hiding behind your computer screen and make statements that are untruths. If you would not reply to someone the very same way if you were there in person with them, you probably should not reply at all. By not replying in kind, you hold yourself to a higher standard and leave the other party left to realize the fool they just made of themselves. Do your best to always take the high ground and set an example of how adults communicate and share differing opinions.

In mind when in newsgroups or message boards that you are in a global arena. There are charters and rules you need to make yourself aware of - before you post. To post, without making this effort could induce responses from seasoned Netizens pointing you to sites such as this or believe it or not - much worse. There will be those reading your posts in countries from around the world who may not have the same religious or social views that you have by virtue of the difference in our cultures. There will also be those who may not have a firm understanding of the English language. Do your best to keep this in mind.

One of the areas to be concerned about are exterior additions to your home such as water softeners or propane gas tanks. Be sure these items are in an upright position, on a level surface and securely attached to the house. These items could become a flying missile in high winds.

All garbage cans and other garbage containers shall be kept inside the garage or screened from view from the street. If you have your garbage can outside of the garage, please check to be sure it is not visible from the street. If it is visible, you will need to request approval to plant shrubbery or install an enclosure to hide it.

Seasonal residents will soon be leaving for their summer homes. Before you leave, please be sure your home is secured for the summer hurricanes, in the event we should have any. All gardens hoses, ornaments, hanging items, furniture, etc. that could become a projectile should be placed inside the unit. This also refers to items left on an open entryway or lanai. A friend or neighbor should be designated to watch the residence in case the property should suffer damage. The time to make preparations is now. When the danger is imminent, local residents will be busy trying to deal with their own property.

Several residents are painting their homes. If you are thinking of painting your home in the future, please be sure to select your paint colors from the Heritage Pines Exterior Paint Color Books at the front desk of the clubhouse. Golf Handicap Committee News

GOLFHANDICAP COMMITTEE NEWS

The Golf Handicap Committee met on Feb 27, 2008 with the following members present: Co-Chairs Joe Paddock and JoAnn McDonald; Pat Kennedy, Bill Stoehs, Larry Churchill, Hal Chase, Celine McLean and Golf Pro Kevin Burnsworth.

It is the hope and goal of our committee that following the rules will lead to "ENJOYMENT FOR ALL THROUGH FAIR PLAY." With this in mind, we chose as the topic of discussion at this meeting the proper procedure for posting scores.

HERE ARE SOME PROBLEMS THAT WE'RE FINDING:

- Posting incorrectly added scores
- Posting scores without applying ESC (Equitable Stroke Control)
- Posting scores from away courses, using Heritage Pines Course Rating and Slope
- There are sometimes discrepancies between your index on-line, and your index on the pro shop computer.
- Snowbirds may not be posting all scores from "Up North".

HERE ARE SOME SUGGESTIONS/SOLUTIONS:

- Designate a "captain" from your group to post all scores after cards have been checked, compared, and added correctly. (Be careful not to double post).
- Your ACTUAL score goes on the scorecard, and is used to determine "winners". Your ESC score goes into the computer, and is used for HANDICAP purposes only.

Use the tables below to determine your ESC score.

- When playing "away" courses, always post your ESC score using the Slope and Course Rating from THAT course. Your ESC deductions should be based on your handicap at THAT course.
- Post scores in pro shop if possible, rather than on-line.
- Ask our Pro, Kevin, how you can make sure that ALL of your scores, whether from here, away, up North, or anywhere get posted.

HERE ARE THE SCORES THAT SHOULD BE POSTED:

- If 13 or more holes are played, the player must post an 18 hole score.
- If 7 to 12 holes are played, the player must post a nine-hole score.
- Adjusted gross scores from all courses with a USGA Course Rating and Slope Rating made during an active season, both at home and away, must be posted, along with the appropriate course and slope ratings.
- Scores in both match play and stroke play must be posted.
- Scores made under the Rules of Golf.

UNDER THE ABOVE PROVISIONS: If you do not PLAY a hole, record par plus your handicap strokes, preceded by an "x". If you do not FINISH a hole, record, using your best judgment, your "most likely" score, preceded by an "x", and not to exceed your ESC max.
