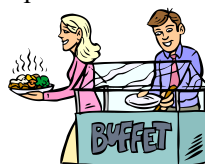

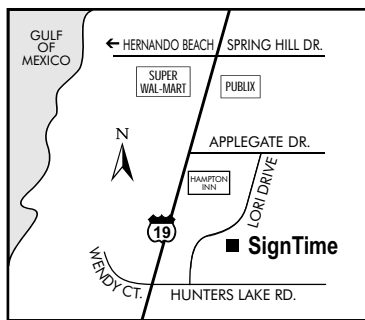

Management Report to Residents Regarding the Completion of Phase I of Construction Projects

Phase I of the construction projects which include pool repairs, replacing pool and patio furniture, installing a new and larger bar; expanding the fitness center, and purchasing new furniture and fixtures for the restaurant and lobby area has been completed.

Pool

The pool repairs were necessary to remedy significant construction defects. There were several large voids under the pool deck. There were also cracks on the pool deck and in the pool. The voids were filled with chemically treated grout, the cracks were repaired, and the pool wall and deck were stabilized. New pavers were installed to replace the concrete. In addition, all of the pool and patio furniture has been replaced. Additional umbrellas and tables will be purchased next summer to provide more shade and seating capacity. Because of wind considerations and safety concerns, the umbrellas will not be able to pitch or bend from one side to the other. Because the cranking mechanism used to open the umbrella breaks too easily, the umbrellas do not have a cranking system. They will open by pushing the umbrella up the pole until it locks into place. The maintenance staff will assist any residents needing help to open the umbrellas. During the summer, the pool monitor will open umbrellas as needed.

New Bar

A new bar was installed outside the back of the lobby area adjacent to the restaurant.

The windows in the bar look out onto the pool and the number 10 tee box on the golf course. The new bar is about 1000 square feet larger than the previous one. It has hardwood floors, a marble top, hickory base and antique brass railings in a "Tommy Bahama" theme. It also has 3 ceiling fans, electric powered blinds on the windows and 3 TVs displaying multiple sporting events such as the NFL Sunday Ticket and the Golf Channel.

The new bar will be open seven days a week and the new bar menu will be available until 8PM. The bar menu includes chicken fingers, wings, nachos, etc. Live entertainment is now provided on Thursday nights.

Since it was opened in October, the new bar has been a major success with residents.

There have been many nights when residents/guests have been two or three deep at the bar. The Food and Beverage staff has been doing their best to keep up with the increased volume. New part-time bar tenders have been added.

Fitness Center

The fitness center was expanded by approximately 500 square feet to accommodate more residents and more equipment. It has a new rubberized flooring along with a new inner/outer thigh machine, two new elliptical bikes and a new dual cable crossover which is ADA compliant. In addition, the old cardio equipment was replaced and new

equipment added. The number of treadmills was increased to four and the number of TVs was increased to three.

Training classes to teach residents how to use the equipment have been extended to meet the increased resident demand.

Restaurant and Lobby Area

A new carpet has been installed in the restaurant. In addition, new furniture, fixtures and art work have been installed in the restaurant and the lobby area all of which is consistent with the "Tommy Bahama" theme.

The F&B department is the hub of social activity for the Heritage Pines community. In an effort to maintain our current clientele, and also reach out to those who don't frequent the clubhouse, we have developed several events, keeping costs low and quality high. We also offer "To-Go" service on all lunch and dinner items, again in an effort to reach out to those who cannot dine with us.

Our restaurant is open six days a week for lunch (Monday-Saturday) from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., and seats 130 people. Prices on our lunch menu range from \$4.95-\$8.95. Our menus are designed with items that have been selected by our community rather than using a standard menu.

We start off with Two for \$20.00 nights which are held on the first and third Mondays each month. The menu for this event consists of nine different meal options, and dessert for the evening changes each time. For our single residents, we also offer One for \$10.00 to ensure we accommodate everyone in our community.

We also offer a variety of All You Can Eat Buffets, Italian Night being by far the most popular. Italian Night is on the second Monday of each month, and features a two hot item buffet, and chef attended Create Your Pasta Dish station. This event costs \$10.95 and is highly popular among our residents, with many large groups and villages coming each month. We are going to start a new All You Can Buffet, on the fourth Monday of each month called Port Of Call Buffet, which will also cost \$10.95. Each month we will feature a menu from a different region throughout the globe.

On Wednesdays, we offer an A La Carte dinner menu, with high end dinner features which are designed by our Kitchen Team. Reservations for this event are often high, with many groups holding standing reservations.

Fridays are a crowd favorite among our community! The first Friday of the month we offer another \$10.95 All You Can Eat Buffet, in conjunction with our Karaoke Night which runs from 5:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. The second Friday of each month is Trivia Night, which offers a plated meal with dessert for \$15.00 (including tax and tip). Each table represents a team, and immediately following dinner, we begin the game which runs much like Trivia Pursuit. The

third Friday of each month is what we call our "Resident Night Out!", which we offer an All You Can Eat Buffet from 5:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. in the restaurant, with prices ranging from \$7.95-\$10.95 depending on the menu. We also offer a variety of entertainment immediately following dinner, ranging from local performers, to Main Stage acts, comedians to ventriloquists, and much more! Prices for Resident Night Out events vary based on the entertainment being provided, but generally cost anywhere between \$5.00 and \$15.00. The fourth Friday we feature another game night for residents which alternates between Name That Tune and Friendly Feud. The games are played much like the television shows that they stem from, and feature a plated dinner with dessert for \$15.00 inclusive.

On the third Sunday of each month, we offers the most inexpensive hot breakfast buffet in town! Our breakfast buffet runs from 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m., and many residents have said it's the best deal they've ever had. We offer a variety of hot pastries, seven hot items on our buffet, and a chef attended Create Your Own Omelet Station. This event is \$10.00 per person, and includes tax and tip.

We also offer a variety of dinner dances on major holidays (i.e. Valentines Day, St. Patrick's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, etc.), and also several times through out the year. The style of these events varies event to event, but can be either a plated meal or buffet, ranging in price from \$20.00-\$25.00 per person (including tax and tip). For these events, we develop an over all theme and go all out from there, from wacky center pieces to crazy balloon displays. These events usually run about four hours, and feature live music from local favorites.

Our newly renovated bar has become quite the hot spot of our Clubhouse as of late. With seating for up to 30 people, we have begun to offer residents all new nights which we have never done before. We have extended our Happy Hour each night of the week, which provides residents with discounted drink prices. Monday, Wednesday, Friday, we offer Happy Hour from 3:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m., and from 3:00 p.m. - close on Tuesday and Thursday. As an added perk, we also use a two ounce pour on all our well liquors, which is exclusive to our bar. Thursday Nights we provide musical entertainment from 6:00-8:00, featuring local performers and duos. The bar also has its own bar menu, which is available from 2:00 p.m. - close every day, and all day on Sunday. Our bar is outfitted with three flat screen TV's which offer the Sports Package from Direct TV. This package allows us to show three different games simultaneously.

Management is currently working with the contractors on a "punch" list to fix items that need to be addressed such as some of the unbalanced tables in the restaurant.

Phase II of Construction Projects

Starting early next year, Phase II of the construction projects will be begin including the following:

- Install men's/ladies' rest rooms in the eastern end of the clubhouse (adjacent to the billiard room).
- Repair/replace the Clubhouse roof, facia, doors, and lobby windows.
- Replace outside Clubhouse paneling with stucco that will be similar to the guard house.

Phase III of Construction Projects

During the summer next year, the expansion of the kitchen will begin.

More information and updates regarding phases II and III will be forthcoming in future communications to residents.

The managers, staff and I would like to thank the many residents who have taken advantage of the new and upgraded facilities by increasing their usage of the bar, the fitness center, the pool and the restaurant. I would also like to invite residents that have not been to the Clubhouse since the projects have been completed, to come and take a look.

Carla Becker



The lady has a talent that is big enough for Broadway. But you won't find her on "The Great White Way." Instead, Heritage Pines residents can enjoy this gifted vocalist in their own Clubhouse.

Ever since arriving in the community six years ago, Carla Becker has shared her love of the performing arts by organizing (along with the help of her husband Roger), acting as

"Mistress of Ceremonies," and singing in the yearly November Talent Show.

"When we moved here, Roger and I thought it would be fun to seek out all the hidden talent in Heritage Pines and share it with everyone," relates Carla. For the first few years she had to ask people to perform. But now that the show has become an annual event, residents contact her because they've seen how much fun it is to be in the show. "This year was our biggest show yet," Carla reports.

All the proceeds from the very affordable show go back into the community. That money has helped purchase sound equipment and a number of items for the PAC room.

Another venue that Carla has coordinated along with fellow resident Sheila Schwartzman is the Mystery Dinner Show. These are themed "murder/mystery" shows that require audience participation. There have been three such dinners and Carla hopes to resurrect them once again. Like the Talent Show, proceeds are retained by the Clubhouse.

She also performs in her village's yearly "Harvest Moon Festival." This block party has grown in size and residents of nearly every village in HP can be spotted in the crowd.

Carla says she was a "late bloomer" with her professional singing career. Self-taught, she has performed at the Show Palace, the Palace Grand, and with the Hernando County Symphony Orchestra. She credits husband Roger for her success. "Roger is what makes the music happen in my life. He really nudged me to perform. He even became a soundman, something he knew nothing about, to help promote me."

The couple started their own company "Songbird Entertainment" and Carla performs for weddings, anniversaries, private and public events.

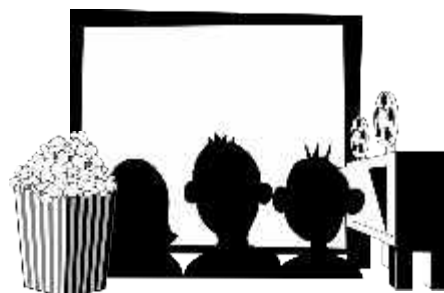

Ask the Techie



Q: I recently purchased a new computer and am getting periodic reminders to create a System Repair Disk. What does this disk do and do I really need to create one?

A: The System Repair Disk is used to boot your computer to recover Windows from a serious error or to restore your computer from a system image. Though rarely needed, it can make the only way to restore a computer to operation following a hard drive failure. As a way to lower costs, most computer manufactures have stopped including this disk.

To create a System Repair Disk you will need a blank DVD. Follow the on screen instructions, label the disk and store in a safe location.

Note – the System Repair Disk is not to be confused with a backup disk which is used to backup documents, photos or other files. I will discuss this topic in a future column.

Q: I am planning on replacing my printer. My current printer is connected to my laptop via a USB cable. Can I get a printer that would allow me to print while in another room?

A: Since you already are setup wireless, you can configure a printer to print from anywhere in your home. However, you must purchase a printer that supports this type connection. All printers come with a USB connect which requires you to be connected to it in order to print. Some very reasonably priced printers include the capability to print via a home network (wireless or Ethernet).

Assuming that you will be placing the printer in close proximity to your Internet modem or router, I'd recommend an Ethernet connection. This is the simplest to setup but requires the purchase of an Ethernet cable for about \$10. If the printer you purchase doesn't include an Ethernet connection or if it is not in the same area as your Internet modem, then wireless is your only option. You will need the same security key used when your laptop was originally setup wireless.

The software CD included with the printer will take you through the steps to get your printer setup on your network. If you have more than one computer, each can be setup to print to your new printer. **Submit questions for future columns to Dale Mallek – dale.mallek@verizon.net**


Christmas Party

TNR For Feral Cats Works!

Feral cats live outdoors. They are members of the domestic cat species, but are not socialized to humans and are therefore unadoptable. Feral cats choose to reside in locations for two reasons: one, there is a food source, intended or not, and two, there is shelter. Feral cats can lead relatively healthy, natural lives on their own in their outdoor home.



Simply removing animals from an area creates a vacuum. Catching and removing the cats may temporarily reduce the number of feral cats in a given area, but two things happen: intact survivors continue to breed, and other cats move in to the now-available territory. This is known as the "Vacuum Effect".

Catch and kill doesn't work, yet it continues. Animal control agencies have been catching and "humanely" killing cats for decades in a misguided attempt to reduce the number of feral cats in a given area, even though the number of outdoor cats does not decrease. This endless, cruel cycle is not supported by the public and is a gross misuse of tax dollars. The vacuum effect is just one reason catch and kill is so ineffective. In our area, animal control will not come to our community to trap cats. Feral cats brought into the county facility are simply put to death. Even tame cats cannot find homes, but feral cats have no chance at all. Humane organizations almost routinely are full and will not accept cats, tame or feral.

Trap-Neuter-Return does work. This program involves humanely trapping, spaying or neutering, vaccinating, and returning adult feral cats to their outdoor homes. All feral kittens are adopted into available homes. With the TNR program, there are no more kitten births; the population stabilizes. And the returned neutered cats' lives are improved. Behaviors and stresses associated with pregnancy and mating, such as spraying, yowling or fighting, stop.

Not only does Trap-Neuter-Return make good sense, it is also a responsible, humane method of care for outdoor cats. Kitty Coalition of Heritage Pines is dedicated to this effective program.

When we first brought Katie home, we noticed something different about her eyes and after several visits to the vet, we were sent to the Veterinary Ophthalmologist, Dr. Wolf. At six months he diagnosed glaucoma and her eye pressure was very high. He informed us that there was a big

possibility that Katie could lose her sight. It could happen at any time. We had to make a big decision. She went on the same eye drops that I was taking and if any of you take drops for glaucoma, you know they come with a hefty price tag. We decided to keep Katie because by this time she was one of the family, a decision that we have not regretted.

The day Katie lost her sight she became depressed (along with Tom and me). We all managed to get through those first few days, by learning from the Internet and talking to several people that had blind dogs. We felt that a good life for Katie would be possible.

Katie went through training once as a puppy, but is doing it again. We felt the retraining would be good for her since she lost her sight. The only problem she has is learning "up" when she can't see what she is jumping up on. That doesn't stop her jumping onto the couch at home.

Katie now gets around just fine even though she bumps into things now and then. She still plays with her toys and likes to play fetch. It just takes a little longer for the fetch part. Katie lets me know when one of her best friends, Mickey, Murphy, Reilly, Sammy, or Bones is passing by. She definitely is the Queen Bee amongst all her boy dog friends. Katie is one happy camper.
