



Know the Signs and Symptoms

Some heart attacks are sudden and intense; however, most heart attacks start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. Often people affected aren't sure what's wrong and wait too long before getting help. Here are signs that can mean a heart attack is happening:

Chest discomfort. Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness, or pain.

Discomfort in other areas of the upper body. Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw, or stomach.

Shortness of breath. May occur with or without chest discomfort.

Other signs. These may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea, or lightheadedness.

Bricks for Sale! Blue Bags are Coming!

We have found a new vendor for the Gazebo Park bricks. Some of the bricks previously purchased by residents have become "color-damaged." Our maintenance department and the Environmental Issues Committee (EIC) believe this is due to pesticide spraying and reclaimed water usage. Additionally, it appears that some bricks were not sealed properly or not sealed at all. The new program will have two components: new bricks and replacement of colordamaged bricks for those residents who want their bricks replaced. New bricks may be purchased now for \$25. Forms are available at the Front Desk. Color-damaged bricks can be replaced for \$20. Residents who wish to have their color-damaged bricks replaced will have to meet with the Environmental Issues Committee in Gazebo Park in order to identify their bricks. Dates for the "Brick ID Party" will be announced in January.

Watch for information regarding recycling with blue bags. The Environmental Issues Committee asks your help to raise awareness and participation in recycling in our community. We are working with Pasco County and Waste Services, our trash hauler, to increase the number of households that recycle #1 and #2 plastics, metal food cans, and glass. From The Architectural Review Committee...

Fruit Trees

Our policy manual states very clearly that planting fruit/citrus trees is not allowed any longer. The reason for this is the invasion of rats. Fruit fallen from existing trees must be removed from the ground within 48 hours. If residents are going on vacation, please have a neighbor

residents are going on vacation, please have a neighbor check on fallen fruit on the ground.

Lampposts

Lamplight should not have anything obstructing its light. This is a Security Safety rule.

Sinkhole Signs

Many of you may have noticed a large number of signs that were erected by sinkhole contractors. The County required contractors to erect these signs which have a container for permits, etc. Residents have been complaining that the signs are unsightly and a reminder of the sinkhole problems. The County required the signs be up while work is in progress. The problem is these signs remain up for a long period of time after work is completed. In many cases the signs remain up for months. The ARC Committee feels that these signs stay up for advertising reasons. This should be addressed by the Board.

Rules & Regulations Reminders

There have been several violations of the following Rules & Regulations:

- ✓ <u>Drivers in golf carts have been running stop signs</u> and drivers have been speeding excessively. Golf carts & vehicles must obey all traffic signs, both at the Clubhouse and throughout the community.
- ✓ <u>Drivers have been parking in the wheelchair access space</u>. Even if all handicap spaces are taken, no one is allowed to block the wheelchair access space.
- ✓ <u>Drivers have been repeatedly parking in the Fire Lane to run into the Clubhouse for a quick errand.</u>

 You may park on the street in front of the Clubhouse for quick errands or if you are loading or unloading, but it is illegal to park in the Fire Lane at any time.
- ✓ Drivers have been entering the circular driveway in front of the Clubhouse from the wrong side. The circular driveway is one way only. There have been several close calls. Please, before someone gets seriously hurt or worse, do not enter the wrong way.
- ✓ Residents on the Driving Range and Putting Green have not been in proper attire. Refer to the Rules & Regulations to make sure you are in compliance.
- Residents have been freely entering the kitchen and bar areas and helping themselves to beverages. Coffee and tea is set up daily in the lobby for the residents. Only employees are allowed in the kitchen and behind the bar.
- ✓ <u>Many lampposts throughout the community are not working</u>. *Check your lamppost in the evening and make sure that it is working properly.*

The Rules & Regulations of Heritage Pines are in place for your safety and enjoyment. You may pick up a copy of the latest Rules & Regulations at the Front Desk.

Management is prepared to issue suspensions and fines to violators. Please familiarize yourself with the rules so that such action will not be necessary.



Chef's Holiday 7-Layer Bars

With family and friends in town, and all the parties taking place, here is a quick little snack to satisfy any sweet tooth. Its great to bring to parties too!

Heres what you'll need:

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1-1/2 cups finely crushed graham crackers
- 1 cup chocolate chips
- 1 cup butterscotch chips
- 1 1/3 cups coconut
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- 1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk

Directions:

Heat oven at 350°F

- 1. Melt butter and mix in graham crackers. Pat down evenly in a 13 x 9 pan (ungreased). Layer chocolate chips, coconut, butterscotch chips and walnuts. Drizzle condensed milk over top.
- 2. Bake 30 minutes. Cool completely then cut into bars.







Ask The Techie

Q: My computer seems to be running slower than it did a few months ago. Will running the Windows Disk Defragmenter program improve performance?

A: Assuming that you have 15% or more available disk space, running the DEFRAG utility will likely result in little or no improvement in system performance. Beginning with Windows XP the disk format was changed to a more efficient management structure to better manage larger disk sizes.

Check if programs you've recently installed on your computer that you don't use frequently are loading automatically when starting the computer. Programs such as Skype and Microsoft Messenger can significantly impact performance especially on older XP systems with less than 1GB of memory. Additional toolbars loading when Internet Explorer starts can also slow down your Internet browsing activities. Toolbars such as ASK are not needed and should be removed via the CONTROL PANEL. Add/Remove Programs function. They also tend to reduce your viewable window in Explorer.

As mentioned in a prior column, consider upgrading computer memory if your **XP** system has less than 1GB of memory. For VISTA or Windows 7 systems, my minimum memory recommendation is 3GB.

In addition, I'm aware of a hard drive failure on an older computer during a disk defrag. The result was file damage and a loss of data. My recommendation is to not run the defrag utility if your computer is over 5 years old.

Q: I recently replaced my old Standard Definition TV with a new High Definition model. I am not impressed with the picture quality. It is nowhere near as good as the picture I saw in the store. What can be done to improve the quality of the picture?

A: The first thing I'd suggest is you verify your TV is connected to the cable/satellite box via a Component (Red, Blue, Green) or HDMI cable. A Composite (Yellow) or antenna Coax cable does not provide a High Definition (HD) signal.

If the cabling is correct, try tuning to a High Definition channel. On Verizon these channels begin at 500 and on Bright House at 1000. Channels below these are Standard Definition. If the TV doesn't display the HD channels you should contact your service provider to have HD enabled and to possibly have the set top box replaced. If your TV service is via satellite, check the channel guide for the HD designation.

If you are viewing the HD channels check the box video setting for 1080i. The default box setting for a standard definition TV is 480i which will result in poor picture on an HD TV. These settings are accessible via the MENU or **SETTINGS** button on the remote.





Meet Shadow

On November 27, a kitten was seen in the Summersong Drive area, which seems to have many inter-related cat families. The gray tabby appeared to be between 12-14 weeks old. The Kitty Coalition trap was set up, and within 24 hours "Shadow" had been trapped. Shadow seemed to be a very calm kitten, so 'she' was immediately adopted by a resident.

However, two days later, the resident called the Churchills to say he couldn't manage the kitten. youngster had defecated on the guest bed and knocked over several plants trying to find a way out.

So, the kitten was again trapped, this time indoors, and brought to the Churchill home. Thinking that the kitten could easily be socialized by an experienced cat lady, since it appeared so calm in the trap, we let the kitten out in the Master Bedroom and closed the door. Its first magic trick was to climb the wooden blinds in the Master Bath like a ladder and perch for hours on the header. At this writing, it is more than two weeks later. The kitten mostly lives under the bed. It is the most feral (wild, unsocialized) kitten ever trapped in HP and shows only very slow progress. One wonders how long, if ever, it will take to be able to touch the kitten. Never mind adopting it out. We still don't know if it's a boy or girl and it hasn't been to the vet. It was clearly a mistake letting it out of the trap before going to the vet – both times – but who knew?



For the last three nights, the kitten apparently begins to play with the catnip mouse it discovered. The thumping and bumping goes on all night long, which doesn't help the sleep factor. But, when I peek under the bed, the terrified eyes have softened into a halfclosed, satisfied expression. The other two kittens (Mimi, 6 months and Peanut, one year old) have stopped hissing and things have somewhat returned to normal, if you want to

call it that. Shadow uses the litter box just fine and had no trouble locating the food and water. He knows exactly when we exit the room, which is apparently when he/she comes out from under the bed.

You've heard the expression "like herding cats"? If you want to know what it's like to try to herd cats, just ask the Churchills, who have a circus going at their house. I suppose this isn't a good time to put out a call for more foster homes, but I must try. Kitty Coalition doesn't have a facility – we need loving homes, temporary or permanent. If you are a regular traveler or snowbird who adores cats and kittens, but can't have one of your own, perhaps you would consider being an occasional foster home. So far, we only trap a few per year, so it wouldn't be constant and we would rotate as able. Please call us at 697-3788 to learn more about what is involved with fostering a homeless cat or kitten. Every cat is different – like a box of chocolates – you never know what you're going to get. But the rewards are laughter, love and lots of joy. Please help us!

What is Glaucoma?

The spots usually go undetected until the optic nerve is significantly damaged. If the entire nerve is destroyed, blindness results.

Since moving here from New Jersey three years ago "VALENTINO" has been seen strolling around Waterfall Village with his little, black, poodle friend "Karma". But most HP residents meet "Val" at the clubhouse because he is a working Seizure Alert Dog and

goes everywhere with his owner Meg Amelia. Val has the ability to detect when Meg is about to have a seizure. Usually he will signal to her up to 45 minutes before a seizure. This process has allowed Meg enough notice so she can get to a safe location and take additional medication. Val has even signaled to Meg during the night when she would not have otherwise sensed an oncoming seizure. Meg is able to live alone here in Florida since Val has really enhanced the quality of her life.

Val is a 7 year old white Maltese and completed training in Long Island where he learned basic behaviors that he needed to assist Meg. In addition to basic training Val is able to sit for several hours while Meg plays Mahjongg or attends HP Committee meetings. He is also able to wait long periods of time to "go out" which is necessary when he travels from his home on Brooklawn to visit his family in New Jersey. Val is also active in charity work with the "Angels in the Pines" where he helps give hugs and smiles to all his adopted "aunts". Val has more human friends since he is working everyday but he loves to see Erin, Bella, Sasha, and Precious when he is out with Karma around HP.
