

# Message From The G.M.



We live in a very active community full of walkers, strollers, joggers, runners, bikers, and bladers. But please remember that use of the sidewalks is restricted to walking, and for residents with disabilities (i.e. wheelchairs, hover-rounds, etc.)

Golf Carts are NOT permitted on sidewalks at any time, whether being driven or parked. Also, personal vehicles, whether your own or guests, should be parked in the appropriate spots as well, not blocking any sidewalks. Sidewalks must remain clear at all times for walkers and the disabled.

The Board, Reserve Committee and I are considering starting some golf course improvements. Our first project will be the reconstruction of number 3 green. Then we intend to start some tee re-construction projects. The first tee project will be number 11 tee, then number 17 tee. All of these projects are already paid for from your Association Reserve Fund.

We have started working on the 2012 Association Budget and at this point I have no intention in asking for an increase in the current \$175 assessment. That will be no assessment increase in my four years as your General Manager.



# Messages From The Management



### Environmental Issues Committee

#### The 90's are here

Well, the 90's are here - not the decade but the temps. The cool days of winter are just a memory, but we need to know how to handle these days of summer. For those who are seasoned Floridians you just go thru the normal routines but for those who are new or still adjusting to a Florida summer, I would like to give you some helpful hints.

- First thing you need to do is service your air conditioner at least once a year.
- Change filters monthly during peak use times.
- Fans are a great help in cooling your home. Make sure your blades are set for summer cooling not for winter weather.
- Don't use your ovens, dishwasher, or clothes dryer in daytime to avoid added heating temps in the home.
- Consider replacing windows to double pane low E rated for added cooling and maintaining temps in the house.
- If window replacement is not an option consider putting on reflective film (example 3m type) to reflect solar heat. This also is an aid if the window is damaged in a storm to hold the glass and not implode it into the house when they are damaged by flying debris. Also helps to retain some heat from escaping thru the glass in the winter months.
- Close blinds especially south facing windows and use insulated drapes to aid in cooling.
- Replace any major appliance with an energy star rated to help save on electric cost.

### From the Audubon Committee

Watch for the opening of Paleo Park, Heritage Pines' new park area for residents' use.

Did you know that the fenced in sinkhole next to the #9 fairway is a Florida State registered pre-historic site? The sinkhole site has been selected by the Audubon Committee to be completed as part of our Green Neighborhoods program. The site will be called "Paleo Park" and will be enhanced to create a quiet, reflective area for residents to enjoy the wildlife present in the area. The park will include benches, a walking trail around the sinkhole, informational signs, and a historical marker.

The archaeological history of our community dates back to the Paleo-Archaic period about 12,000 years ago. Native inhabitants utilized the area sinkholes for hunting. Wheedon Island and Timacuan residents inhabited the area from 500-1500 years ago and later on Seminoles. This information was collected and researched by Herb Elliott, a resident and amateur archaeologist. An opening date for the park has not yet been determined but we hope it will be soon. The map shows where Paleo Park is located. Take the second left off Eagle Bend Dr. on to Clearcreek Ct. Drive to the end of the cul-de-sac. Paleo Park is on the left behind the fence.

### Architectural Review Committee

#### "A Job worth doing is worth doing together."

By the time you read this article the ARC for 2011-2012 has had two meetings.

This year the committee has eight members who are going to do an outstanding job. They are not only enthusiastic and energetic, but are well aware how important this committee is to Heritage Pines. Some of our responsibilities are seeing that the deed restricted policies are followed, as stated in the policy manual, approving exterior change forms that have been submitted and above all a good rapport with the residents, helping to keep Heritage Pines a pristine place to live.

At the first meeting it was suggested and approved, that the time of our meeting be changed to 10:30 a.m. We will continue meeting the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month, as in the past. It is only a time change.

This year a training session is being held before each meeting for the new members. Some of the items to be discussed will include explaining the policy manual in detail, property inspections, exterior change forms, etc.

The ARC is asking the HP Board of Directors to approve at their next meeting the following: to send out only one letter or e-mail informing residents of their property infractions, instead of the usual two. In the past, the first letter or e-mail gave the resident twenty-one (21) days to comply. After an inspection, if the resident still has not complied, a second letter or e-mail is sent giving the resident an additional ten (10) days. Now with this one (1) communication it will combine the two (21 days and 10 days) giving the resident thirity-one (31) days to comply. As we have stated, we will not send a second communication. If the infraction has been corrected in the time allowed (31days), the committee says a sincere "Thank You." If it has not been, it is given to the General Manager, where a fine could be imposed. By sending out one (1) communication it will be less expensive for Heritage Pines and less work for the committee.

The policy manual that has been updated will be given to the board of directors for their approval.

The ARC can not keep Heritage Pines a pristine place to live by ourselves; we need your help. Please familiarize yourself with the policy manual. We appreciate your past cooperation and are looking forward to the same cooperation this year.







#### Ask The Techie

Q: I recently replaced my old computer with a Windows 7 laptop. Sometimes I see a message box asking for permission to allow the program to make changes to this computer. Please explain what is happening.

A: This is a new security feature Microsoft added to Vista and Windows 7. This feature is invoked whenever a program that has potential to change a critical function of windows starts. The Window dialog box will include the **Program Name**, **Author** and **Source** (location). You will have **YES** or **NO** buttons allowing the program to run or not. This box should only appear when you are installing a new program, upgrading an existing program or running a program that can change Windows such as Malwarebytes.

I've seen virus programs infect a computer by using the name of a popular program when trying to trick you into installing them. If you see this dialog box pop-up unexpectedly, it's best to click the **NO** button. The worst that may happen is you would have to restart a program update or installation.

If you are not seeing this dialog box, it may have been turned off or disabled. This option is enabled via the Windows Control Panel | System and Security | Action Center | Change User Account Control Settings. The correct setting is the Default setting.

Q: I am considering adding a surround system to my home TV system. I see various systems that include Sound Bars or separate receivers. This is further complicated by the various number of speakers included. Please help me understand my options.

**A:** This is a wide open question that has many possible solutions depending on your budget, viewing/listening habits and your home layout.

A basic system that will enhance the two speaker system built into most TV's is a Sound Bar system with a subwoofer. This system will improve the sound from your system due to the superior sound bar speakers and the additional base sound provided by the subwoofer. The disadvantage of a sound bar is there is minimal separation between the left and right speakers and the lack of a center speaker for dialog. I recommend sound bar systems for small rooms only.

The next step is a system with 3-7 speakers plus a subwoofer. This system has a separate receiver that directs the sound to the free standing speakers. A top end five or seven speaker system properly installed will produce a surround sound experience equivalent to a concert hall or movie theatre. If you enjoy listening to CD's or other audio sources consider a 5 speaker system. Rear speakers can be installed via a wireless transmitter when adding wires through your attic is not possible or beyond your budget.

When connecting your cable/FIOS/satellite set top box to you system, use a cabling system to maximize your system. If you want your system to output high quality sound, connect them using either HDMI or Optical Cables.

"Every time a golfer makes a birdie, he/she must subsequently make two triple bogeys to restore the fundamental equilibrium of the universe".

#### Hydration – Are You Getting Enough Water?

With the weather warming up, you need to be aware of your body's temperature and not get over heated on the golf course. If you do not keep your body properly hydrated, you will not be able to perform as well as you could. It is recommended that you drink fluids, like water and Gatorade, in smaller amounts on a regular basis and not wait until you get to a drink station every 6 holes or so. In order to do this, you should carry a bottle or two with you and refill them as needed at the water stations. A good rule of thumb is to drink eight ounces of fluid before you even tee off, then continue to drink four to eight ounces every 15 minutes of play. Dehydration creates fatigue, makes you uncomfortable and can cause you to lose your mental focus —an important element in your golf game.

AND don't forget your sunscreen!!!!! Stay safe and have fun!


