

The General Manager Search Committee has appointed Beth Barnetson as the chairperson and they are holding meetings once or twice a week. The job description has been written along with the advertisement for the position. Committee members are also researching salaries in communities which are similar to Heritage Pines. Blue Bag Recycling Increases. Recycling Makes Money for Heritage Pines de

Congratulations to those residents who have started to participate in curbside recycling. According to our trash hauler, Waste

Services, the percentage of households that are recycling via blue bags has increased from 19% in November to 24% in January. Although that may not seem like much, it is a significant increase. Please talk with your neighbors and let's see if we can get that number even higher. Blue bag recycling means less trash sent to the incinerator and less harm done to our environment. Pasco County sorts and then sells the recyclables creating revenue for the county. Increased county revenue helps to keep taxes from rising.

Our other recycling programs bring revenue directly into Heritage Pines. The Environmental Issues Committee utilizes the money for projects that improve the environmental quality of our community. In 2011, the recycling of cardboard, paper, newspaper, aluminum cans, and cooking oil returned \$6570 to HP. Some of the projects paid for with these funds in 2011 included: purchase and installation of four benches; advertising for Hazardous Waste Collection Day; fencing, signs, and opening of Paleo Park; plants, gutter and downspout for gazebo, and rain barrel for Gazebo Park; Environmental Fall Fest at Gazebo Park; and Audubon International annual membership.

We now have two Green Fiber collection bins for cardboard and paper. The new bin is located off Heritage Point Drive next to the boat/RV storage area. **Reminder: Please break down all boxes so that space is not wasted in the bins. If the newspaper bin in the recycling center near the cart barn is full, you may put newspapers in the Green Fiber bins.** Don't forget to recycle household batteries, fluorescent tubes and compact fluorescent lights, too. There are receptacles for those items inside the Golf Cart Barn. Let's continue to increase our recycling efforts for our community as well as our planet.

From the CDD

The CDD is currently funding a study looking at the possibility of providing reclaimed water to all of Heritage Pines. With the study currently underway, the CDD would like to educate residents better in regards to reclaimed water. Over the next three months, the CDD will provide information through the newsletter answering many questions in regards to reclaimed water.

What is reclaimed water?

Pasco County's reclaimed water is highly treated wastewater produced through an advanced wastewater treatment process. This process eliminates harmful byproducts while retaining beneficial elements, such as nitrogen and phosphorus that are useful as fertilizer when reclaimed water is used for irrigating landscapes.

What are the benefits of using reclaimed water?

- Serves as an alternate source of irrigation water that reduces demand on potable water sources utilized for drinking water.
- Reduces the cost of landscape irrigation when it replaces potable water.
- Reduces fertilizer costs due to the nitrogen and phosphorus in reclaimed water.
- Beautifies our community by enhancing the appearance of landscaping.

How is reclaimed water processed?

The wastewater treatment and disinfection process requires four steps:

- Step 1: removes large solid materials from the wastewater.
- Step 2: uses microorganisms to break down smaller solids.
- Step 3: separates undesirable compounds and fine suspended particles from the water.
- Step 4: uses chlorine to eliminate disease-causing viruses, bacteria, and other organisms.

What is the quality of reclaimed water?

Pasco County produces reclaimed water that meets all the State requirements for utilization of reclaimed water for irrigation of residential lawns and other public-access areas, such as parks, playgrounds, school sites, golf courses, etc.

Is reclaimed water safe?

Yes. To ensure safety, the highest standards established by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection are followed. System controls utilized by Pasco County Utilities are among the most stringent in the nation. There are no documented public health problems associated with the reuse of properly treated and disinfected reclaimed water.


The level of treatment received by reclaimed water makes it **acceptable** for the following uses:

- Irrigating lawns and most landscaping.
- Use in fountains and decorative pools (they must be clearly marked as containing reclaimed water).

The degree of treatment required for the use of reclaimed water makes it **unsuitable** for the following purposes:

- Consumption by humans.
- Bathing, cooking, or toilet flushing in residential dwellings.

- Interconnection with any other water source.
- Recreational use involving body contact (i.e. swimming pools or outdoor showers).
- Irrigation of vegetables or other edible crops which are not peeled, cooked, or thermally processed before being consumed.
- Aboveground hose bib connections where a hose might be mistakenly used for any of the above.

Beefy Italian Skillet

Makes: 4 Servings Prep: 35 min Cook: 1 hr 15 min

Ingredients:

- 1 pound boneless beef round steak
- Nonstick cooking spray
- 2 cups sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1 cup chopped onion (1 large)
- 1 cup coarsely chopped green sweet pepper
- 1/2 cup chopped celery (1 stalk)
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 ounce can tomatoes, undrained and cut up
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil, crushed
- 1/4 teaspoon dried oregano, crushed
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper (optional)
- 8 ounces dried whole wheat or regular spaghetti
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese (optional)

Directions:

Trim fat from meat. Cut meat into 4 serving-size pieces. Lightly coat an unheated large skillet with cooking spray. Heat over medium heat. Add meat to skillet; cook each piece on both sides until brown. Remove meat from skillet.

Add mushrooms, onion, sweet pepper, celery, and garlic to the skillet. Cook until vegetables are nearly tender. Stir in undrained tomatoes, basil, oregano, and, if desired, crushed red pepper. Add meat to skillet, spooning vegetable mixture over the meat. Simmer, covered, about 1 1/4 hours or until meat is tender, stirring occasionally. Meanwhile, cook spaghetti according to package directions.

Transfer meat to a serving platter. Spoon vegetable mixture over meat. Serve with spaghetti. If desired, sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.

Ask The Techie

Q: I am currently using Internet Explorer to access email and the Internet. Some of my family and friends suggested that I should switch to Google Chrome while others say I should use Firefox or

that Safari is the best. Which browser do you recommend?

A: If the performance of your computer is acceptable, I'd recommend that you stay with **Internet Explorer**. Web site developers test their web sites using Internet Explorer and I've seen occasional compatibility problems with the other browsers. You should verify that you are running Version 9 on **Windows Vista** or **Windows 7** and Version 8 on **Windows XP**.

If you are running a Windows XP system that is running slow and the computer has less than 512MB of memory, I recommend that you install **Google Chrome**. On a slow computer, **Chrome** is often faster than **Internet Explorer** and tends to have the fewest compatibility problems.

Even if you decide to make **Google Chrome** or another program your default browser, you will continue to have **Internet Explorer** available.

Q: Do you recommend that I power off my computer when I'm not using it?

A: For the casual user, I recommend that you turn your computer on in the morning and don't turn it off until you are done using it for the day. Turning it off and on numerous times during the day is hard on the electronics and may shorten the life of your equipment.

At the end of the day, do a **SHUTDOWN** via the **START** Button on the Taskbar. I don't recommend using the **SLEEP** or **HIBERNATE** functions.

If you schedule automated backups or other programs to run during the night, you should not shut down your computer. I do suggest that even if you leave your computer on, you do a **RESTART** once every week or two. This allows Windows to perform cleanup functions that need to be done occasionally.

In the event of an electrical storm, I always advise shutting down the computer to avoid an abrupt shutdown if electrical power is lost or damage to the electronics from a power surge.



The Definition is amended so that a player has addressed the <u>ball simply by grounding his club immediately in front of or</u> <u>behind the ball, regardless of whether or not he has taken</u> his stance. Therefore the Rules generally no longer provide for a player addressing the ball in a hazard (see also related change Rule 18-2b).

As she probes into Sarah's past, and reveals the taboos and silence that surround this painful episode, she begins to reevaluate her own life." 

What is Oigong?

In past articles I have extolled the many benefits of Tai Chi & Qigong, and they are many and varied, but what is this thing called *Oigong* (chee kung)? Originally called *daovin*, which means "guiding the flow of internal energy (qi)", it has been practiced for over two thousand years in China. Qi, often translated as *energy*, is more of a verb than a noun – it means relating. It is the result of yin and yang (the two opposite forms of energy) coming into being. When a being arises, yin and yang arise and interact, and qi is formed. Gong is the circulation of energy produced by the relationship of vin and yang.

So the practice of *gigong* is cultivating a relationship with energy - becoming aware of the energy that circulates and flows through your being. *Qigong* is practiced in different ways as a spiritual discipline, in martial arts, and for health and longevity (this last benefit of qigong practice is the most widely accepted use in the western world, and is the focus of the qigong I teach here). Of the many forms of Qigong, the best known form is Tai Chi.

The Saturday morning class is devoted to learning, and practicing *Qigong*. Most forms of qigong are performed standing, however, if due to physical limitations you cannot stand too long, the benefits can still be attained by executing the moves sitting down. The exercises are slow and gentle and are structured to exercise both the mind and body, as well as rejuvenating and replenishing the Oi or "life force" within you. Qigong is an energy practice, not a stretching or calisthenics exercise. All qigong exercises cultivate energy, flexibility, health, and awareness.

PLEASE NOTE: Revised class days and times. Beginners are now on Tuesday morning at 8:00 a.m. in the PAC room. Advanced students are on Thursday morning at 9:00 a.m. in the Magnolia Room. Qigong is still the same schedule at 9:00 a.m. in the Magnolia Room.

Ear-tipping For Ferals

If you have ever come across a stray cat with what looks like one ear tip cut off, then you have found a feral cat that has been humanely trapped, neutered, given a rabies shot, ear-tipped by the vet and then returned to his/her habitat. Likely, a devoted volunteer is looking after the cat each day to keep it healthy. According to the experts on feral cat behavior and management, this is the best and most effective way to care for older or unadoptable feral cats.

As explained in previous articles, feral cats are neither domestic pets, nor wildlife. They are the recent descendants of un-neutered pets that were abandoned by an irresponsible human. Kitty Coalition was formed by caring volunteers to humanely keep our homeless cat population under control.

If you find a stray inside our gates and both ears are intact, please call us to arrange trapping. We will attempt to learn where the cat eats and spends most of its time, and then enlist the help of a resident to monitor the trap. Once the cat is trapped, we will take it from there. All kittens are adopted out and only adult ferals with no adopter are placed back outside. We need to have some of them outdoors to 'claim the territory' and prevent un-neutered ferals from moving in. Currently, we have four ear-tipped ferals living outdoors. Plus, we have two cats without the tipped ear since they were trapped and neutered before this practice became standard. Janet, a gray tabby female who lives in the Brooklawn Dr. area and Mr. Kitty, a male gray tabby manx breed, who lives in the Hilltop Village area.

Once a month, the Heritage Pines Kitty Coalition sends out a bulletin by e-mail, with updates, photos and information on our stray and feral kitties. If you would
