



# Management's Report to the Residents

There seems to be a group of residents that are putting out misleading, and in some cases, untrue information about the Association's Management and the financial condition of the Association. One rumor is that there will be a \$2,000 special assessment to residents. That rumor is clearly not true.

The current assessment of \$175 per month will be the same in 2012.

#### There will be no assessment increase next year.

In fact, next year will be the third consecutive year with assessments at the \$175/month level. That is the longest period of time without an assessment increase in the short history of the Association.

Other accomplishments achieved by the Association over the past few years are summarized as follows:

- The Association turned a small deficit in 2008 of \$5,504 into significant surpluses of \$206,999 in 2009 and \$319,793 in 2010. The 2011 financial forecast shows a surplus of \$324,137.
- The Association's net assets (assets minus liabilities) have increased by more than \$3.5 million since 2008.
- Your investment in the Association's net assets has increased from \$143 per home in 2008 to more than \$2,600 per home as of the end of 2010.
- The Association's total expenses included in the 2012 budget are lower than the expenses levels in 2008.
- The Association remedied significant safety issues related to the pool and had major expansion/repair projects completed on the clubhouse and guard house with no need for a special assessment and no need to borrow money.
- The contributions to the Association's reserve fund have increased from \$25 per month in 2008 to \$30 per month in 2010 and \$33 per month in the 2012 budget. As the Association's assets increase, the contributions to the reserve fund should be increased accordingly. In addition to increasing the contribution rate to the reserve fund in 2010 and 2012, the Association injected \$490,000 of cash into the reserve fund in 2009 following the settlement of the lawsuit with Lennar. The current contribution rate of \$30 per month compares favorably to the Miller Dodson recommended contribution rate of \$29.42.
- The Association's operating fund year end cash balance target each year is between \$400,000-\$500,000. It has been more than \$400,000 for 2009 and 2010. It is expected to reach \$450,000 by the end of this year.
- As of September 30, 2011 we have \$633,599 in operating CASH and \$890,024 in Reserve CASH. Our TOTAL CASH in our bank is \$1,523,623.

Residents need to know the Association is in a strong financial position and it has accomplished many positive things over the past few years.

Other information recently circulated is in regards to our clubhouse construction/renovation projects. The amount of \$257,842 has been reported as total "job overruns" associated with all of the 2010 and 2011 projects to date. Although, the "industry" definition of the items in that total is "overruns", it is important that the residents are made aware of what the majority of that \$257.842 includes. Our new restrooms in the east end of the building and a much needed facilities office (total \$90,000) is part of the figure. Additionally, the new lobby windows, which were provided for in the reserve study (\$44,731) are included and a total of \$40,365 of Pasco County mandated impact fees and bringing the west restrooms into ADA compliance were also part of that total. If we removed these items from the total and add back in for the amounts that we "under-spent" on some projects, that brings the total to \$27,980, which we feel represents the true "overruns". That being said, we plan to implement new procedures to ensure future construction/renovation projects are proposed as accurately as possible from the start.

Ask The Techie

Q: As you suggested in a previous column, I purchased an external backup device. Should I use the Windows built in backup utility or is there a better alternative available?

A: Most external backup devices include backup software that can be configured to save your documents, photos, etc. either manually or automatically following a schedule you set. However, if you are running Windows Vista or Windows 7, the built in backup utility will do an excellent job in saving your documents. It can be configured to run Daily, Weekly or Monthly.

A personal favorite of mine is Iomega QuikProtect. It is a free program that can be setup to work real time backing up documents whenever they are changed. It also allows for multiple versions of documents to be saved automatically. This capability can be used to recover work product that is developed over time. I like this program because it is easy to use and the saved documents are readily available via Windows Explorer if needed.

#### Q: I have replaced my old desktop computer with a new laptop. The laptop bottom seems to be very hot and it is not comfortable resting it on my lap. Is there something wrong with my new computer?


A: No, it is not likely that there is anything wrong with your new laptop. While you are using the laptop the computer processor (CPU) generates heat which will often make the bottom of the laptop feel warm or sometimes even hot. On some laptops there may be vents on the bottom to help cool the computer.

It is important that the bottom and rear cooling vents be unobstructed. Never set your laptop on a cushion, pillow, placemat or any soft surface for any length of time or it may overheat. Operating a laptop in our warm Florida climate for an extended period of time may even shorten the life of your computer. In extreme conditions a laptop may shutdown if the internal temperature gets too high.

It is best to rest your laptop on a smooth surface such as a TV tray or table. I personally have a cooling pad/chill mat to help keep my laptop running cool. These pads contain a cooling fan that connects to the laptop via a USB connection to help dissipate heat buildup. The pad not only cools the laptop it provides a comfortable surface to

rest the laptop on my lap. They can be purchased online or at most electronics stores for \$15-30.
