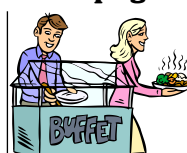

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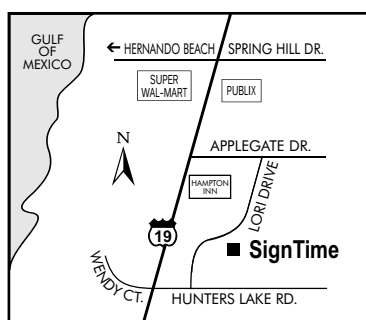

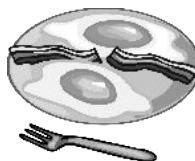

Messages From The Management

Community Paper Recycling is Here!!!

The Green Fiber Company has placed a green bin in our recycling area for paper and cardboard recycling. Here are the DOs and DON'Ts.

DOs

1. **DO** recycle the following – cardboard food boxes, magazines, office paper, phonebooks, other cardboard, junk mail, brown paper bags, construction paper.
2. **DO** place items in a paper bag or cardboard box. Be sure to break down and flatten all boxes before putting them in the bin. Paper bags work well because you can stuff them full and then put the whole thing in the bin.
3. **DO** continue to put newspapers in the separate blue bin. (We get more money from a different hauler for newspapers.)

DON'Ts

1. **DON'T** put trash or blue bag recyclables in green bin.
2. **DON'T** put wet paper in bin. Green Fiber will not accept it.
3. **DON'T** put other unacceptable items – glass, aluminum, metal, string, plastic bottles, styrofoam (including packing peanuts), plastic bags – in the green bin.

We will receive rebates from Green Fiber depending on weight of recycled items. All funds are used for environmental projects in Heritage Pines such as benches, trees, etc. Green Fiber turns the paper and cardboard into high quality fiber insulation sold primarily to companies like Lowes and Home Depot.

Revisiting the Dispute and Resolution Committee

Recently, a new resident presented a question to a committee member as to what exactly was the function of the Dispute and Resolution Committee.

To answer that question thoroughly, some background information is needed. In keeping with the policy of living in a "deed restricted" community, the Homeowners' Association formulated Rules and Regulations with the intent of giving everyone a common understanding of what is expected in ensuring a harmonious community. These Rules and Regulations were compiled and written by homeowners and approved by the Board. Many of the hearings we have had in the past would probably have been avoided had the parties involved been more familiar with the regulations.

The committee can consist of 3-5 members and acts as an appeal body for anyone who has been cited for a Rules infraction and disagrees. The Committee acts independently of the Board and its decisions are final.

This year has been an unusually quiet one for the Committee with hearings down to a minimum. This can probably be attributed to two factors; 1- the diligent job being done by our General Manager, Bill Berthold who has resolved many issues before having them be appealed to the Committee:

2- Residences who have familiarized themselves with the rules and regulations and seem to have a better understanding of them and their own responsibilities.

In any event, this is an encouraging sign and we are hopeful that this trend will continue into the future.
