Numbers, Symbols & Words

Your Daily Warmup Puzzles

In bridge we manipulate puzzles involving numbers, symbols and words and strive for logical solutions (or at least inspired guesses). In each issue this week we will feature a pair of number/symbol puzzles, an easy one here on page two, and a harder one on the inside back cover; and, a word puzzle at the bottom of this page. In all of these puzzles, you will be able to solve them without guesswork, by logical deductions alone, which is what we're all trying to do at the table.

Today's puzzle is called **Keen**. (It appears in several newspapers as KenKen.) Like Sudoku, your objective is to fill in the numbers 1 to the grid size, once in each column and row. Groups of cells marked off by thick lines are called 'cages.' The numbers within each cage must add, subtract, multiply, or divide to make the target number, listed at the top left of each cage with the math symbol. Unlike Sudoku, a cage may have the same number more than once, as long as the number does not appear twice in the same row or column.

The easy version is below. Hints, and a more difficult puzzle will appear on page 15. A super difficult one is on page 14. Answers will appear in the Wrapup issue of the Daily Bulletin. For more warmups, check out the word puzzle on page 5.

Oregonians break Trautman's Open Pairs streak

It couldn't have helped matters that the Bulletin item I wrote yesterday was probably as good as putting a bullseye T-shirt on **Greg Trautman**, who had won every Open Pairs he has entered this week, until Saturday. Event winners **David Brower** and **Christopher Gibson**, however, put together a 63% and a 65%, winning by more than a full board and breaking the streak. B strat winners were **Dex Stuberg** and **Joel Fuhrman**, whose afternoon session was 0.02% better than their evening session. C strat winners were **Aaron Mohrman** and **John Krah**, who got out to a big halftime lead and stayed half a board ahead. Oh, and despite being a bullseye, **Greg Trautman** and partner **Eddie Bishop** held their own, breaking average on the day.

Top on a board: 12. Average for the event was 312. Winning scores were 403.36 (A), 349.05 (B), 323.86 (C). To make the overalls you needed a total of 354.72 (A), 318.20 (B), 286.45 (C). Average masterpoints for players in this event: 2560 (afternoon), 2534 (evening).

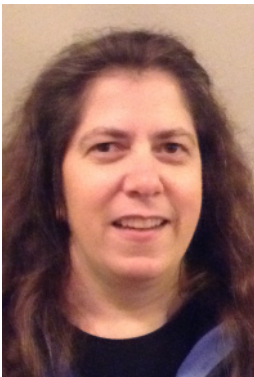

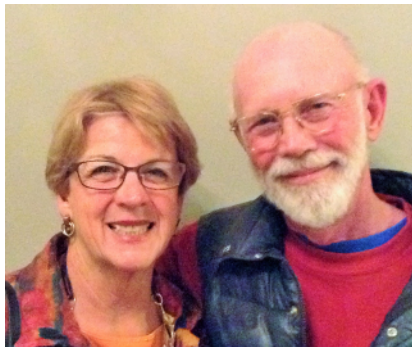

Purchase entries by credit or debit card! Entry coupons will be sold just outside the main playing area, near the Partnership Desk, before evening and afternoon sessions. The small surcharge has been eliminated for this tournament, so cash and credit/debit entries cost the same amount. You still need to get in the main line for entries, so give yourself enough time purchase your coupons if you want to buy them.

FedEx Office at the Capital Mall has done a nice job of printing our Bulletins this week, and my quest is to arrive as they open and give them the memory stick, so as not to have to wait in line. For the first three days (Wednesday-Friday), this was a quick bus ride, but on Saturday the first bus would not arrive until about an hour after they opened. So, I walked. Took about an hour. It rained lightly the whole way, but I survived and bussed back. Today I need to get to the transit center downtown to take a bus to the FedEx Office near Lilly Road, since the Capital Mall outlet does not open until noon. We should also thank Tips for Tops Speakers **Pat Dunn, Dick Yarrington**, and **Steve Hosch** for giving up their free time to make presentations that were well worth attending.

Keen Hints

Introductory Puzzle on Page 2

Keen recap: Fill the grid in Sudoku-style, no repeat numbers in rows or columns. The cages (areas boxed in by thick lines) must add, subtract, multiply or divide to the target number indicated.

Keen hints: Some cages immediately fill themselves: a two-cell cage marked 11+ in a size-6 grid must be 5 and 6 (or 6 and 5). No other cell in that row or column can have 5s or 6s. Once you can reduce the possibilities for a cell down to a handful of possible numbers, write the possibles in small figures and look for further clues to help you complete rows and columns. You'll be working out numbers mostly from the cage clues at the outset, and complete the puzzle using Sudoku-style strategies (what number is left to go here?)

Now can you do the easy puzzle on page 2? How about the more difficult one on this page? Also, check the word puzzle on page 5 and the really difficult Keen puzzle on page 14.
