Numbers, Symbols and Words

Your Daily Warmup Puzzles

In bridge we manipulate puzzles involving numbers, symbols and words and strive for logical solutions (or at least inspired guesses). In each issue this week we will feature a pair of number/symbol puzzles, an easy one here on page two, and a harder one on the inside back cover; and, a word puzzle at the bottom of this page. In all of these puzzles, you will be able to solve them without guesswork, by logical deductions alone, which is what we're all trying to do at the table.

Today's puzzle is called **Rectangles**. We start with a grid of cells, some of the cells with numbers in them. Your job is to divide the grid into rectangles of various sizes, such that:

- every rectangle contains one numbered cell
- the area (in cells) of each rectangle is equal to its number

Can't get much easier than that! Remember that squares are rectangles as well: a rectangle of size 9 may be 1x9 or 3x3 in size!

The easy version is below. Hints, and a more difficult puzzle will appear on page 19. Answers will appear in tomorrow's Daily Bulletin.

only common English words are used, no centuries-old arcane words that are found in crosswords. You'll do best by looking for the locations of the hard letters first: QU, X, J. Be sure to mark off the letters used in the checking area beside the grid to keep track of your progress. It's not as difficult as it seems! I did most of these in 3-6 minutes.

A list of words in the puzzle (in alphabetical order) is on page 15. If you need a more limited hint, ask someone to examine the word list and tell you if the list contains, for example, a six-letter word starting with D and ending in E.

1016½ tables times four is 4,066 player-sessions, during which 4,699.05 masterpoints have so far been given out. This means that an average player has won 1.16 masterpoints per session played. The Tournament leader **Mary McCune** has played seven sessions and won 49.02 points for an average of just over 7 masterpoints per session. Not bad! Non-LM Members may buy the entry with a credit card but leader **Xiang Tu** has played nine sessions and won 28.76 for an average of 3.20 masterpoints per session. **Sandy Freeling**, our 199er leader, has played seven sessions and won 7.32 for an average of 1.05 per session. How are you doing?

At the lower left is a look at the Open Pairs results for Board 14 last night, showing the board, high card points, tricks available double-dummy, and even a gauge of how well the Law of Total Tricks works on this deal. The C button allows easy copyable format so you can send the deal to a friend by e-mail and keep the formatting. At right are the results and contracts, and even a column that tracks how many tricks were taken in comparison to the expected number. The top tab bar allows a quick jump to any deal in the set, a useful feature.

Kelsey's Challenges

Test your team play!

Edinburgh bridge writer Hugh Kelsey hit upon a great method of presenting interesting hands in a series of books in the 70s and 80s. The reader sat South for a 64 board match and was presented with a difficult problem to solve as declarer or on defense on each hand. Bidding and carding agreements were natural so as not to get in the way of the problems.

Every solution included what happened at the other table in a top flight team match, and if you got most of the problems right you would end up with more IMPs than the imaginary opponents.

Here are some more problems selected at random. You could be 42 IMPs up or 34 IMPs down or somewhere in between on the first six.

Board 7 (top of next column): West leads the four of spades. You try the jack from dummy but East produces the king and fires back the ten. When you allow this to win, East continues with the three of spades to knock out the ace. You run the queen of hearts successfully, East playing the two and West the three. How should you continue?

spades, wincing when dummy goes down. North follows with the eight and East with the three, and you switch to the two of hearts. Dummy's queen wins the trick, North playing the four and East the five. Declarer plays the five of diamonds from the table to the three, ten and jack. How should you continue?

Kelsey’s Challenges

(problems on page 7)

Board 7: It looks a simple hand. With one spade, two hearts and a diamond, you appear to need five club tricks. What could be wrong with playing a club to the ace and finessing the jack? If you do so, you dissipate the small extra chance that is available in hearts:

Before touching clubs you should play the jack of hearts from dummy, forcing a cover. If West started with doubleton ten of hearts, you need only four club tricks. If not, you have lost nothing since you can still make the contract by bringing in the clubs without a loss.

At the other table, the contract and play to the first four tricks were the same, but the declarer played a club to his ace and lost to the queen on the next trick. A diamond return took out declarer's last entry and it was too late to try to set up a third heart trick. East refused to cover the jack of hearts and the contract

was defeated. Take 10 IMPs if you found the play of the jack of hearts at trick five.

Board 6: Declarer has nine tricks (assuming six trumps) once the ace of clubs is gone. A tenth trick may come from the fourth diamond if diamonds are 4-3-3-3. A trump return will allow declarer to discard a diamond on the king of spades, cash the ace of diamonds and ruff a diamond, setting up the fourth diamond.

You can prevent this only by taking out the club entry before the diamonds are established. It will not do to play ace and another club, for that allows declarer a club ruff on the table. The correct return is a low club.

You were hopeful about this board, since 3NT is a make on a likely spade lead. At the other table, however, your teammates were in four hearts and South led a diamond, setting up four tricks for the defence. You therefore needed to find that return of a low club to tie the board. If you did anything else it costs 10 IMPs. More tomorrow.

Book Reviews

The Art of Declarer Play
by Tim Bourke and Justin Cornfield
“The more you sweat in practice, the less you bleed in battle.”

Now how's that for a quote from a bridge book? Tim Bourke's latest effort (with Justin Corfield) targeting more advanced players opens with this quote and uses it as a theme throughout, providing excellent examples of card play that will challenge you to think through many issues in advance so that you'll be prepared for them when they come up at the table. The authors follow Sun Tzu's Art of War approach, emphasizing **recognition** of the key issue, **visualization** of how to address it and **realization** (execution) of the solution.



Here's a fun example. In the hand below, trick one starts with the two of hearts opening lead, followed by the nine, jack and seven. East continues with a trump, which turns out to be stiff. If you get stuck, come see me at the bookstore to check out the book! (This is Hand #6: Two Aces Wrong.)

Rectangles Hints

Introductory Puzzle on Page 2

Rectangles recap: Divide the grid into rectangles of various sizes, so that each rectangle has a single numbered cell, and the area of each rectangle is equal to its numbered cell. Squares are rectangles too, don't forget!

Rectangles hints: Look for unusually high numbers or prime numbers. High numbers like 35 will be a 7x5 rectangle, and often there will be only one way to place it. Prime numbers like 2, 3, 5, 7, and 11 can only be a rectangle with a width or height of one, and can often be easily placed. As is so often the case with these puzzles, the optimum strategy often involves starting on the edges and working in. But be sure that there is only one way to make a rectangle of the given size before you mark it in—especially if you use a pen.

How about the more difficult one on this page?
