# Numbers, Symbols & Words

## Your Daily Warmup Puzzles

In bridge we manipulate puzzles involving numbers, symbols and words and strive for logical solutions (or at least inspired guesses). In each issue this week we will feature a pair of number/symbol puzzles, an easy one here on page two, and a harder one on the inside back cover; and, a word puzzle at the bottom of this page. In all of these puzzles, you will be able to solve them without guesswork, by logical deductions alone, which is what we're all trying to do at the table.

Today's puzzle is called **Dominosa**. A normal set of dominoes (0-0 through 4-4 in the easy puzzle, 0-0 through 6-6 in the harder one) has been arranged into a rectangle, the number in each cell then written down and the dominoes themselves have been removed. Your task is to reconstruct the pattern by arranging the set of dominoes to match the grid of digits.

A list of the dominoes in the set is provided below the grid, so that you can mark the ones you have found.

The easy version is above. Hints, and a more difficult puzzle will appear on the inside back cover. Answers will appear in tomorrow's Daily Bulletin.

only common English words are used; there are no unfamiliar, arcane centuries-old words found only in crossword puzzles. You'll do best by looking for the locations of the hard letters first: QU, X, J. Be sure to mark off the letters used in the checking area beside the grid to keep track of your progress. It's not as difficult as it seems! I did most of these in 3-6 minutes.

# Okanagan Notes

## Some world class Penticton pride

Think for a moment about what it means to be considered world class in what you do.

World class means that you can compete effectively with the best on the planet, whether it be sports, games like bridge, or some other measurable skill. Once you reach the 'world class' level you retain it even if newer and younger competition has passed you by. It would be crazy to deny someone like hockey's Wayne Gretzky or bridge's Mike Lawrence the title just because they don't play at the highest levels anymore. World class is for life.

We have often seen world class bridge players, even some actual world champions visit Penticton and we have several with us this year. (Trust me, they know who they are!)

World class in a high-profile category means at least a little bit of fame, and if you come from a city like Penticton, world class means you will be very well-known locally. Walk a few blocks past the oldest building in this area, Penticton's Memorial Arena, and you will see something amazing:

The arena was built in 1951 and Penticton entered a team in a local hockey league, and by 1954 they were Canadian champions and had earned the right to play in the 1955 world championship in Germany. The 1954 world championship was the first contested by the Soviet Union, which developed its hockey program starting after World War II almost in secret. By 1954 they were ready to

compete with other world class players, and they won the world championship, defeating Canada's representative handily in the final game. The Soviets had arrived and were undoubtedly world class. It would take 18 more years for the Soviet team to face the best Canadian NHL players rather than the best senior team (or later, selected players from the best teams in the country) -- but we know how that went: Canada's pros won, but by the thinnest of margins. In 1954, it looked like the Soviets were going to

succeed at international hockey like they did at chess.

The Penticton Vees were not having any of that. In 1955, the two teams met in the final game of the tournament, both undefeated. Penticton won 5-0.

Outside the arena you will find the names of all who participated

on that team sixty years ago, earning the world class title with a victory Canada's team would only very rarely win against the best Soviet players in

the decades that followed.

And tonight, we get a visit from another Penticton-born talent who has earned that world class title.

**Adam Fitzpatrick**, born in Penticton, performs an Elvis tribute that has won many international competitions.

And you scoff. Elvis tributes, really? Hey, we've all been there. But stay and watch and you will see a world class professional at his craft. Adam's act includes Elvis songs and costumes from different eras, an ease with the crowd that recalls The King, as well as a singing voice that sounds like a young man in a Memphis recording studio in 1955, along with pitch-perfect intonation and selections that will surprise you. All this from a young man, not yet born when Elvis left us, who entered a local contest on a dare as recently as 2008, won the contest and immediately launched into a very successful career.

The Elvis impersonators and imitators that filled minutes of late-night monologues in the late 1970s and early 1980s have been replaced with a new group of talented people called Elvis Tribute Artists, and one of the world's best is from this very place. Sure, Elvis may not be "your thing." But check it out, at least for a few minutes at the end of the evening session tonight, and you may actually find that it is after all. If a local hockey team can travel to the other side of the world and beat the Soviets, why can't a world class local talent be the best Elvis Tribute Artist on the planet?

## Introductory Puzzle on Page 2

**Dominosa** recap: The grid of digits represents a complete set of dominoes (listed below the puzzle) formed into a rectangle. Your job is to discover the location of each domino.

**Dominosa** hints: Look at each possible domino, beginning with the doubles (which are easy to spot) to see if there is only one possible spot for them in the grid. There will be a few that you can mark off right away. Finding some of these will reduce the possibilities for the rest of the grid, and sometimes will tell you that two adjacent digits must be a domino (otherwise there would have to be a leftover cell). If you find a 5-3 in this way, you can mark a line between other adjacent 5-3s in the grid. Slow progress at first, but it will come together quickly at the end!

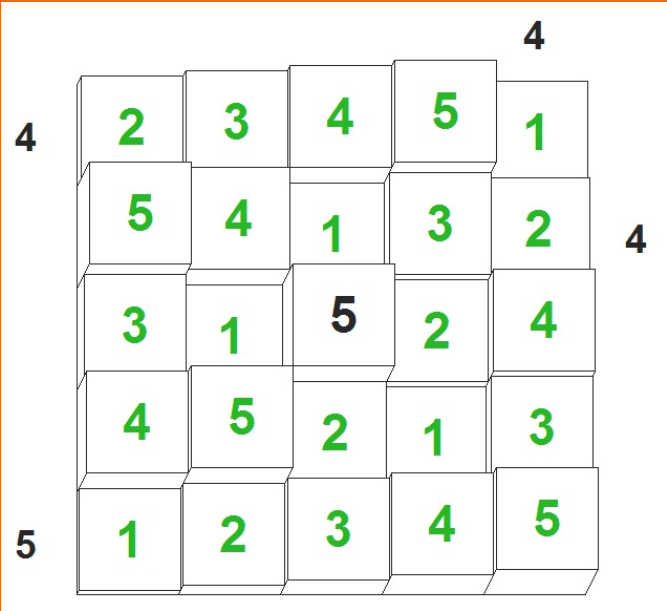
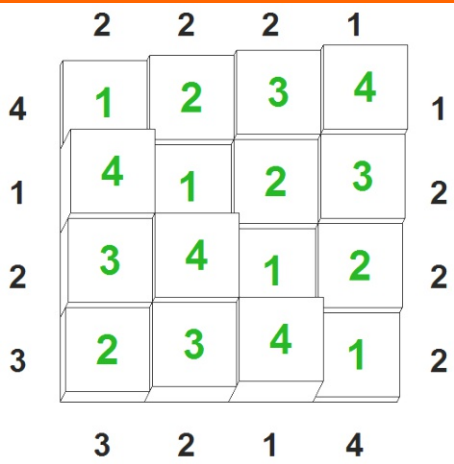
