ABOUT 100 BLACK MEN OF SILICON VALLEY INC.

The 100 Black Men of Silicon Valley, Inc. (100 BMSV) was officially awarded its charter from the National Confederation on May 22, 1993, and is a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt, non-profit California corporation. Prompted largely by the diminishing federal dollars to combat the ills facing minority youth, 24 community leaders formed the Silicon Valley chapter with the expressed goal of addressing issues faced by local African-American youth, which have contributed to disproportionately high levels of school dropouts, criminal convictions, teen pregnancies, sexually transmitted diseases, and poverty.

Through its affiliation, the Silicon Valley chapter is supported by the 100 Black Men of America, Inc., which acts as the national spokesperson, demonstrating the unity and strength represented by a membership that purposely touches a wide spectrum of activities and pursuits in urban as well as suburban communities throughout the nation.

The 100BMSV is currently comprised of 38 members that are led by a Board of Directors that consists of four officers: Chairman/President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Directors, and the Immediate Past President.

Committees are established under the guidance of a Director and each Committee has a Chairman that is responsible for the implementation of programs and projects. 100 BMSV major Committees include: Mentoring, Education/Scholarship, Economic Development, Health and Wellness, Membership, Gala, Public Affairs, & Church Relations. Each chapter member is required to join, and actively participate in one or more of these committees.
