## CALIFORNIA ALLIANCE OF AFRICAN AMERICAN EDUCATORS CELEBRATES 15<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY WITH BLACK-TIE GALA HONORING AMAZING LEADERS, PARTNERS AND INVESTORS

**San Jose, September 28, 2016** – The California Alliance of African American Educators (CAAAE) is excited to announce a celebratory Black-tie Gala in recognition of its 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary on Saturday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> at the Marriott Hotel at San Francisco Airport, 1770 South Amphlett Blvd in San Mateo at 6pm.

Since its founding in 2001, the vision of academic excellence and cultural resiliency for students of African ancestry has guided CAAAE's work to fulfill its motto, "*education for liberation.*" More than 600 students have completed organization's award-winning STEM program—the Dr. Frank S. Greene Scholars Program (GSP)—and are in college, graduate school or careers as examples of what high expectations, rigorous instruction, culturally rich support and parental involvement can combine to achieve.

CAAAE's impactful programs are focused on comprehensively addressing the academic and cultural barriers to success and include direct service to students in addition to GSP, specifically the Dr. George Washington Carver Scholars Program (CSP), its STEM program in the Bayview/Hunter's Point area of San Francisco; advocacy activities such as the Black Minds Matter Summit & Rally; parent and student empowerment through Project WORD (Working On Redefining our Destiny); and leadership development through Black Students of California United. CAAAE also offers exceptional professional development summer institutes in partnership with Stanford University's School of Education.

On the occasion of its 15<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, CAAAE members will celebrate the organization's remarkable past and highlight individuals who have been vital to the progress and impact made directly and indirectly on students, parents, educators, administrators, researchers, policy makers and others who realize the importance of educational equity, particularly for Black students. The honorees listed below represent the founding and current board members and co-coordinators, community partners, philanthropic investors, equity advocates, educational leaders and research legends who consistently demonstrated a belief in and support of California Alliance of African American Educators' unapologetic approach to academic excellence and cultural resiliency.
