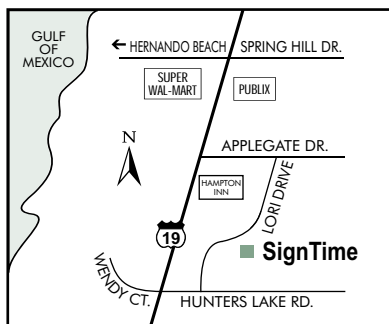

Signs of spring are popping up all around us with beautiful flowers blooming and a fresh green color of our trees returning. It brings a sense of renewal and happiness. As promised, we have good news regarding our golf course. We are bringing in an outside contractor to take care of our golf course, our driving range and our common grounds. Down to Earth Landscapers, well known in the Villages for their wonderful work, will be on-site shortly. Our GM and the Board of Directors (BOD) interviewed a grounds superintendent, a consultant and three landscape contractors. Many thanks to Bill Crusselle for his diligent work investigating all the possible avenues to handle BOTH the golf course and our common grounds. Both Management and the Board agreed that Down to Earth would be the best fit for Heritage Pines.

Space in the Clubhouse is also on the Board's radar. We are in the process of moving our current woodshop at the end of the Clubhouse to a new building on the property close to the recreational vehicle parking area. It will be a freestanding building twice the current size, with more windows and ventilation, and will definitely be a step up for this amenity. At the same time, this allows us to repurpose the present woodshop space into much needed office space for our staff.

Your Board of Directors has been busy working on a long-range strategic plan for Heritage Pines (HP). This will allow future BODs to begin their tenure with a sense of direction that will ensure progress. As always, it can be changed as our needs change. We encourage residents to come to our workshops and listen as we talk over our ideas. There will be

time for residents to comment and we would appreciate hearing your suggestions.

Our finances remain in good condition with reports of doing exceptionally well in Food and Beverage and Golf for the last two months. These are not normally profit centers and we would like to congratulate those Department Managers and their staff.

Committee Chairman have been interviewed and selected and will soon be hard at work. If you have never thought of volunteering for any of the positions available or you are new to HP, we would encourage you to give us a try. It is work; it is fun; and, best of all, you make wonderful friends.

FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

April certainly turned out to be a very busy and productive month. After much research and many meetings over the past five months the Board has voted to hire Down To Earth (DTE) to take care of the golf course and common grounds; a decision that was supported by our resident golfers. DTE is a Central Florida company with an outstanding reputation that generates over \$70,000,000 in revenue in Florida. Many of you have heard of the Villages which has well over 600 holes of golf and has common grounds throughout the entire development. DTE maintain nine of their golf courses and seven of their communities common grounds. They start on the first of this month and will be working with our current staff to learn about our golf course and community.

Another positive was the financials that came out in April for the first quarter of the year. Operating Net Income was \$45,403.00 better than budget for the first three months. A couple of things worth mentioning is that both F&B and Golf exceeded their budgets for the month of March and F&B exceeded 2017's actual revenue by \$11,917. Thanks to all our residents who have been supporting the club and community this year by attending the events, using the dining room, and playing golf.

As everyone is aware, we had numerous projects that were completed in April. The Gazebo is complete and is just beautiful with the new structure, lighting, and flowers. The front entrance lighting of the flowers at the waterfall and the new lighted fountain have given the front entrance a new look that has upgraded this area. The new building that covers the ball dispensing machine should be done by now if the weather cooperated the last two weeks of last month. The new phone system was installed the later part of last month and we now have a much better system that allows more lines to be installed if needed and better quality phones and service. The land surveys were also done for the new wood shop in late April and progress should be made this month in getting this long awaited project completed. This month we will also begin the painting of the Clubhouse and we will be sending out more on this as there will be workers around the building during the day while painting.

If you are leaving us for the summer we wish you well and hope that you have a safe trip and if you are staying here we look forward to enjoying the Florida summer with you here at Heritage Pines.

HPCA'S RESERVE FUNDS PROGRAM 2018

Our Reserve Funds Program was established in 2005. Lennar Corporation then contracted with Miller + Dodson Associates to provide HPCA with a Reserve Funds Program in accordance with Florida Statute 720 and National Reserve Study Standards. The Miller/Dodson's staff and the HPCA staff reviewed our requirements and developed the 2005 report. The study has been updated several times in 13 years and is currently under review for 2019.

The Reserve Report lists 448 items divided into 41 categories.

The 448 items have been costed out and have a onetime replacement value of \$11,781,652. Next each item is assigned the economic life expectancy and the projected remaining life expectancy. All this information is provided to Miller/Dodson to be entered into our information database. The information is then imputed and spread out over a 30 year period. The current funding for 2018 thru 2046 is \$20,094,690. *(Note: during the 30 year period reserve items may be replaced several times.)* **The 2018 reserve funding requirement of \$38 per house per month is the current 2018 HPCA Reserve Assessment.**

The 448 items listed in the Reserve Program cover all HPCA'S amenities large and small. Some of the items in the list are: the golf course, road system, large landscaping replacement projects, exterior and interior of the Clubhouse, four individual restrooms, pump house, maintenance building, cart storage building, swimming pool, tennis court, bocce court, craft ovens, all sidewalks, six large water pumps, office equipment, telephone system, security systems, library computer system, all large purchases of furniture for the Clubhouse, pool tables, sound systems, flooring replacement, perimeter fence and gate systems, major kitchen equipment, 12 HVAC systems, and many other items.

Your reserve program is a living document. The cost of the items is continually being updated for individual cost increases, new items added, inflation, and unexpected replacement projects.

Thank you for your interest in the reserve program.

FROM THE ACCOUNTING DEPT.

2018 HOA Fees

The monthly assessment amount is \$185 per month for Heritage Pines Community Association. Many of the village assessments have changed as well. Please check with your village manager if

you have any questions on that amount. You do not have to do anything to change monthly automatic debit amount if you are set up for ACH. It will be processed at the new amount.

ACH and Online/Email Services

If you are not set up for automatic debit (ACH) , please consider this simple process. It's easy to set up and you don't have to worry about anything except deducting the amount from your checking balance each month. And in case you did not know, we never deduct your HOA fee before the third each month. We had many requests to hold off until the third from members that don't receive their direct deposits until then. Also please consider doing away with paper statements. You can view online or have emailed. Just request an "Opt out of paper statement form" from the office, fill out and return with your email address.

Out of Town Mail Service

Recently it was brought to our attention that some mail does not get forwarded if the name on your account is something different, like a trust for example. If you are going out of town for an extended period of time, please let us know in the office. We can set your mail to go to another address so you don't miss important association mailings. Just remember to give us a call or email to change it back when you return home.

Member Charge (Jonas) System

We always ask that you bring your member charge card to the club for purchases. This just helps prevent charge errors. If you do not have your card, please do not sign your charge until you have verified it has correct member information at the top. Also as mentioned before, our Jonas system separates your HOA fees and club charges, so we need to have them paid separately. We appreciate that most monthly accounts are current and if not it is usually a one time oversight and we take that into consideration. Please keep in mind club charges not paid by the 20th of following month can be assessed a \$25 late fee as well as HOA fees not paid in the month they are due for.

HERITAGE PINES VISITING GUESTS

Important Notice from the Heritage Pines Clubhouse in Regards to Guests:

We understand that there are times when you have family or friends visiting and you are not able to accompany them to the Clubhouse or pool.

Effective May 10, 2018, you will need to register your guests at the Clubhouse front desk. You will be given a guest card/cards for your visitors to use at the pool or in the Clubhouse. The card has an area for you to authorize or deny charge privileges for the guest on your "[HPCA Member Account](#)." We will not be able to allow them to member charge without a signed guest card and can only accept cash or credit card as payment.

This policy is to ensure your wishes are followed in regards to your guests.

GOLF COURSE AND COMMON GROUNDS MAINTENANCE NEWS

It looks like we are finally into a warmer weather pattern after several false starts. Recent rainfall has also been very beneficial to help kick off our spring turf growth. Greens were aerated last week and the course has been fertilized and treated for insects. The driving range was sliced, fertilized and sprayed for insects as well. Our next course closure is set for May 9th and 10th at which time we will be aerating the entire course. Plant replacement is underway as we continue to rehabilitate our landscape after our harsh winter. A major upgrade at the Driving Range will be completed shortly. A new block building is being constructed near the tee that will house our range ball machine, protecting it from the elements. Test results from the plant pathology lab at the University of Tennessee will be received in the next couple of days. I spoke with Dr. Bronson regarding these tests this morning. He stated that our bluegrass samples had tested positive for herbicide resistance and that this problem is becoming more common throughout our region. The results will help us determine an improved strategy for controlling this species in the future.

We are awaiting bid submissions for the plant installation project at the Clubhouse. Bids are due in a couple of weeks at which time we will choose a contractor for the project. We look forward to completing Phase 3 this summer. The new Wedding Gazebo has been completed and the landscaping installed. Check it out when you get the chance. It really turned out nicely.

Our featured plant this month is the Orange Bird of Paradise which we have recently installed at the front entrance to Heritage Pines and at the wedding gazebo. A native of South Africa these orange showy flowers resemble a bird in flight. The plant grows to a height of five feet, grows as a clump of thick concave leaves that are six inches wide by about a foot in length. The leaves are attached to a stalk that can reach five feet in length. Bird of Paradise prefer full sun and thrive with a moderate fertility program. Don't over fertilize as this inhibits flower production. One fertilizer application per month during the growing season is usually sufficient. Moderate moisture levels are required for optimal growth and these plants tolerate reclaimed water quite well. Can't wait to see ours in flower this summer.

- ✓ Battery and cable connections and condition.
- ✓ Battery Cage – Inspect, clean and neutralize battery acid. (Additional cost to remove batteries and neutralize cage.)
- ✓ Charger – Examine plugs for proper connection. (At Request)
- ✓ Check brakes and cables, clean and adjust if necessary.
- ✓ Tires – Check pressure, examine for cuts and excessive wear.
- ✓ Check operation of fuses, light, horn and warning buzzers.
- ✓ Check all wiring connections.
- ✓ Steering and Control Linkages – Check for proper operation and lubricate.
- ✓ Accelerator – Check for proper operation and lubricate.

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STREET LIGHTING PROJECT

By J Bart Cutshall

Holy mackerel! The concept of the adding new street lighting started way back in April, 2017. There has been a lot of communications and onsite meeting with WREC, and many obstacles to overcome. And even now, some still remain; but on Friday, April 6, 2018, the first lights were illuminated in Webster Grove (between Grand Club Drive and Bent Pines), and on Windlestraw. The new lights are power conserving LEDs and produce more light with less expense.

This is just the first part of phase one, which includes lighting for the area where Grand Club Dr. crosses Water Lily, behind the 14th tee box and restroom. On Monday, April 9, 2018, WREC erected the light poles for this area. By the time you are reading this article, these lights should be activated.

The current obstacle is subsurface obstructions and infrastructure; i.e., water pipes and electric conduit. The CDD has received the bid price for boring which has been compared with the price to repair and restore the areas disturbed by trenching. I was told the price WREC is preparing is phenomenal compared to what the CDD could get on its own, and WREC representative was right. The savings is almost 65% less than restoring the grounds, and will be virtually unseen.

The CDD will continue to move forward with this project and hopes to accelerate everything now that all the pieces are finally in place. The next meeting for the CDD is scheduled for Tuesday, June 12, 2018 at 2:00 p.m.

AD HOC GROUNDS COMMITTEE PHASE III

The Heritage Pines Ad Hoc Grounds Committee for Phase III has been meeting for several weeks to help produce a plan which will revitalize the landscape around the front of the Clubhouse to include the entry way to the parking lot across Scenic Hills Drive. As a group, the committee strove to create a plan that was financially responsible while adding color and enhancing the tropical resort country club feel of the community.

With the tireless assistance of our expert in-house staff: John Burns - Superintendent of Grounds, Amy Potter - Superintendent of Common Grounds, and Chris Ansley - Assistant Superintendent of Grounds, the committee approved a plan that:

- Was well under budget.
- It does not require additional reclaimed water usage.
- Is maintainable by our current in-house grounds staff (this

does include the addition of sod in some areas which can be mowed versus requires hand weeding and annual mulch replacement).

- Includes the limbing and pruning of 32 live oak trees.
- Will recycle (throughout Heritage Pines) any usable plant material that might be removed which is healthy and still has several years left in its life expectancy.
- Enhances the color scheme of our Clubhouse's exterior.

The request for bid was published with responses due back to Heritage Pine April 23rd. With the approval from the HP Board of Directors work could begin by the end of May.

ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES COMMITTEE

Curbside Recycling

Each year during the months of January, February and March the Environmental Issues Committee (EIC) asks Heritage Pines' (HP) trash hauler to count the number of homes that participate in curbside recycling twice a month. This year's numbers were interesting: during February and March 2018 an average of 703 households participated in curbside recycling, but in 2017 the average for January, February and March was 837 homes. Although the number of participating households decreased, the total tonnage collected actually increased, from 22.68 tons in 2017 to 26.01 tons in 2018. The reasons for this are unclear but perhaps more folks are recycling paper and cardboard along with cans, plastic items (#1 through #5, and #7) and glass bottles now that paper is allowed to be recycled at curbside. Another way you can recycle paper in HP is to use the large bins located near the golf cart barn or the ones near the RV parking area off Heritage Point Drive. Paper deposited in the large bins generates money for environmental projects in HP such as benches and educational materials. Please note that these bins are for paper and cardboard ONLY. A bin-full that's contaminated by non-paper items generates NO money for our HP community.

Each year in March the EIC sponsors a "hazmat" collection day in cooperation with Pasco County.

ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES cont'd

This year 145 residents of HP participated. Each participant received a reusable tote bag "Heritage Pines Thank You for Recycling." The following items were collected: 1.67 tons of paint, 36 electronic items (TV's, computers, monitors), three lead acid auto batteries, 270 fluorescent bulbs, 400 lbs. of household waste (pesticides, cleaners, small batteries, etc.)

This year the Pasco County folks used a scanner to divert household hazardous waste from disposal to reuse. They determined that 86.9% of what was collected was diverted to reuse. That's good news!

Many thanks to all you dedicated recyclers. Keep up the good work and may your numbers increase. Roughly half of HP households now participate in curbside recycling. We can do better!

The maintenance of operation or appearance of any installation is the homeowner's responsibility.

If it should be necessary for you or the contractor to run vehicles or equipment over common grounds to do work at your home or on your property, you must first obtain permission from the General Manager and Village Board (if applicable) before any work can begin. Any damage caused must be repaired at the homeowner's expense. Before any work on the property begins it is suggested that the homeowner informs the contractor, or people doing the work, that it is their responsibility to repair any damages done to common grounds by their equipment. Ultimately the homeowner will incur all expenses related to damages

COUNCIL OF VILLAGES

Bill Crusselle, General Manager

The Board approved a golf management company to manage the golf course, driving range, and common grounds, to begin May 1, 2018. It is a very large company and they work throughout the state, including properties in The Villages. They will keep our employees for at least 90 days and they are guaranteed the same pay and benefits.

Gary Wind, Facilities Maintenance

The new gazebo arrived today and we will install new lighting and landscaping around the gazebo.

The driving range maintenance building that was destroyed in the storm is now under construction. Inspections will begin next week. The range will be open as long as no construction is taking place at the time.

The new Clubhouse phones will be installed next week.

There will be a demo on the new elliptical machine with a front fly. The residents did not care for the last demo that had a rear fly.

Resident question: What type of material is the new gazebo made of?

Gary: It is pressure treated lumber with metal roofing, painted copper.

Bill: The current phone system is maxed out. New lines cannot be added for new offices, and we cannot make direct calls to Gate House or the Maintenance Building.

Herb Hurley, Golf Professional

We will be posting daily e-mails on the Driving Range for when it will be open.

Resident question: When will tee times be available on the website?

Kim: Jonas is still working on the website and just yesterday informed us that they are in the final stages.

Resident question: The numbers on the tee sheet are confusing, they jump around.

Herb: Part of the problem is the way the way the golf course is set up with shotguns. The way the tee sheet works is that the front side and back side are on opposite sides but when printed it's all put together. Complained to the software company about it but that is the way the program is set-up at this time.

John Burns, Golf Course Superintendent

Bids for Phase III of the landscape project are out and we should be collecting them by the end of the month.

The Audubon Recertification for the Golf Course is complete. Thanks to Sara Brundage for the documentation. We are the only course in Pasco County that is Audubon Certified.

Bill: The Audubon Certification is framed and hanging in the lobby.

Resident question: When will the certification be on the score cards?

Herb: We have a lot of score cards now, but will add the certification when we order new cards.

Resident question: What new things do you expect with the new golf course management company?

John: He and Chris Ansley have both worked with management companies. When working on large projects they provide more manpower.

Bill: They are giving us \$56,000 in labor, plants, straw, and sprigging. In the first 10 days that they are here, they will have 6 men starting wherever we agree that they need to be, trimming bunkers, trees, planting flowers, etc. We will be saving money on our equipment lease. Anything that we buy for the golf course, we get at a lesser cost.

Resident question: Do they have any insight as to the fairways and a plan?

Bill: The improvement would be renovation.

Resident question: What about recovery?

Bill: More testing is being done and there will be more people working on the problems. We have to honor the golf packages that have been sold, but may possibly close the golf course in the future (not before 2019) for renovation.

Resident question: Why don't we sod the fairways?

Bill and Herb: The cost for sod would be astronomical!

Herb: Sprigging gives it a much cleaner, tighter knit of the grass because it's growing in together as opposed to sod. Ask any superintendent and they will say sprig.

Resident question: The bat house by the driving range steps was destroyed in Hurricane Irma. Can we get a new one?

Gary: Herb Elliott used to build them. We have the plans and could possibly do that.

Resident comment: Thanked John Burns and Chris Ansley for the maintenance efforts on the common grounds.

Resident question: How many villages have sealed off their wells?

Gary and Kim: We do not know of any villages that have done this.

Bill: Some wells have collapsed, but the ones that are usable are being saved as back-up.

Resident: We are ok with leaving them and ignoring them, but was wondering if anything needs to be done with them.

Gary: Will connect with our county engineer to see if anything should be done.

Resident question: Saw a Pasco County transit bus in Heritage Pines. Is that set up for us to use? Bill will check into it.

Resident comment: There are a lot of weeds and shrubs that need replacing around the Clubhouse.

John: It's been a hard winter, and they are working on replacement of plants where necessary. Some of the plants will come back with the warm weather.

Bill: Many areas around the Clubhouse will be demoed.

Resident comment: There are a lot of dead pines.

John: A tree company is coming next week to remove about 25 dead or dying pines. There are pine tree infestations throughout the area.

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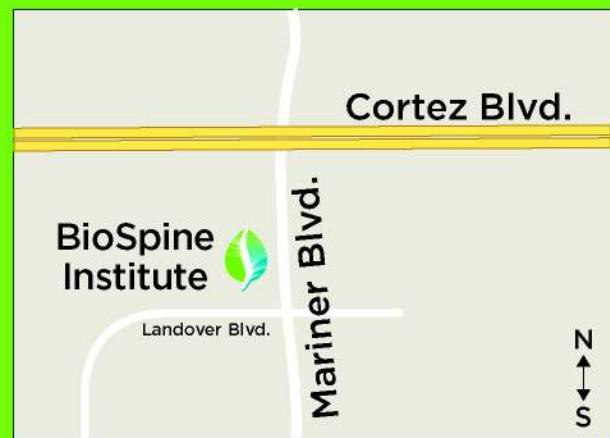


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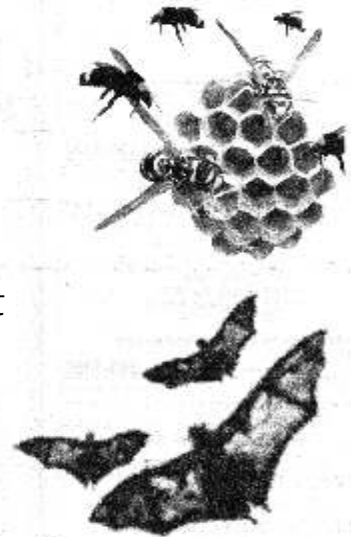
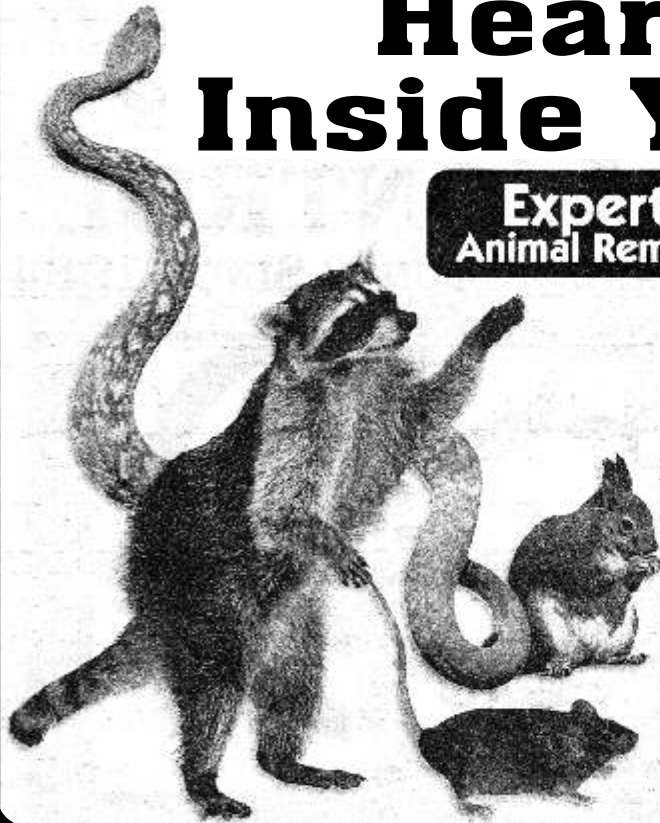
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MEN'S GOLF ASSOCIATION

GOLF HANDICAP SYSTEM

"Two basic premises underlie the USGA Handicap System, namely that each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round regardless of where the round is played, and that the player will post every acceptable round for peer review. The player and the player's Handicap Committee have joint responsibility for adhering to these premises."

It's that time of year when many of our members leave us to go north for the summer. We all wish you safe travels and have a great time whether you stay here or are off traveling.

We would like to remind you that while you are away if/when you are golfing you are to continue to post your scores to the GHIN system. If you belong to another club that utilizes the GHIN system, you can have the same GHIN number and your scores will automatically be posted to both courses.

When playing nine-holes, post the nine-hole score. Do NOT wait to have another nine-hole round to put with it. The GHIN system will keep track and post a COMBINED "C" score when

the second nine is played, even if it's the same nine-holes.

You can post your scores using your cell phone or on-line. These methods are useful when playing courses other than your home course.

As always, if you have any questions regarding handicaps or posting scores, do not hesitate to contact someone on the handicap committee or our golf pro, Herb.

TREES OF HERITAGE PINES

You see trees every day. But have you ever thought about the benefits of trees? Trees are a very valuable part of landscapes.

- Trees improve air quality by removing particulates and air pollution.
- The shade they cast on buildings can lower summer temperatures and reduce energy costs.
- They increase property values.
- They can help reduce pollution and flooding by taking up water with their roots—water that would otherwise have flowed off the landscape and created storm water runoff.
- Well-chosen and -maintained trees can also help protect your home from hurricane-force winds.

According to the American Forestry Association, each year a single tree in the landscape provides \$73 worth of air conditioning savings, \$75 worth of erosion control, \$75 worth of wildlife shelter, and \$50 worth of air pollution reduction. If the resulting annual total of \$273 is compounded for 50 years at 5 percent interest, it results in a tree value of \$57,151. Therefore, the overall benefits of having trees in the landscape outweigh the initial price and maintenance cost of each tree. (from the University of Florida, <http://gardeningsolutions.ifas.ufl.edu/plants/trees-and-shrubs/trees/>)

Did you know that in the past 100 years, people have tried to make this location a citrus farm, and more recently a lumber plantation? This area is designated as the "Sandhills of Central Florida", zone 9A which means we can expect occasional winter temperatures of 20-25 degrees. Anyone who has put a shovel into the ground understands that description. In 2006, when the developer completed pushing dirt around and pouring cement, and many of us were moved in and looked around where we found the area now known as Heritage Pines was lacking trees in the common ground areas. The County required replacement of trees for the trees destroyed by the developer, and a committee of concerned owners worked to achieve an agreement with the developer to replant appropriate trees in common ground areas including on the golf course and along both sides of Grand Club Drive. The site plan was administered by H.P.'s original Environmental Stewardship Committee. The variety of native tree species planted along Grand Club Drive include: Southern Magnolias, Winged Elm, Florida Maple, Palatka Holly, Sweet Gum, Bald Cypress and Redbud. The variety ensures that any diseases that may target one species, doesn't destroy everything on the grounds. Now, as then volunteers continue to contribute to a sustainable natural environment in our community.

In the residential neighborhoods our community hasn't been as successful. There is a significant reduction in our Heritage Pines tree canopy with removal of oaks because of insufficient replacements. Trees benefit all of us with shade and other

environmental benefits. Drive through Timber Oaks sometime and you will notice a beautiful shade canopy of mature oaks. The H.P. Architectural Manual (and Pasco Ordinance) requires a minimum of two trees per lot. A permitting process is required for removal. According to Pasco Ordinance Chapter 800, Section 802 (Tree Preservation and Replacement), before a tree is removed home owners should have a Licensed Arborist or Certified Landscape Architect provide written verification that a tree is causing damage and that mitigation efforts such as pruning roots are not appropriate therefore the tree should be removed.

Use the Pasco County "recommended tree list", which is reprinted in this newsletter or you can find it at <http://www.pascocountyfl.net/DocumentCenter/View/14188>. Use the principle of right-plant, right place to determine a replacement tree appropriate to the location. Again, referencing the H.P. Architectural Manual, no fruit trees of any kind are approved for Heritage Pines residential property.

Except for the Sabal Palm (Florida State Tree), Washington and Date Palms (non-native), palms are not recommended as shade canopy trees. You can find the attributes/characteristics of various trees.....for our zone, mature width and height, wildlife value, shade, etc....at sources such as www.fnps.org (which is a native plant index); or <http://lyra.ifas.ufl.edu/FloridaTrees/index.html> (which is trees for urban and sunburn sites); or <http://www.floridayards.org/fyplants/index.php> (which is Florida friendly plant descriptions).

Florida Arbor Day was in January. National Arbor Day was April 27th. Plant a tree or contribute to planting a tree in our National Forests at <https://shop.arborday.org/memberships-trees-to-forest.aspx>.

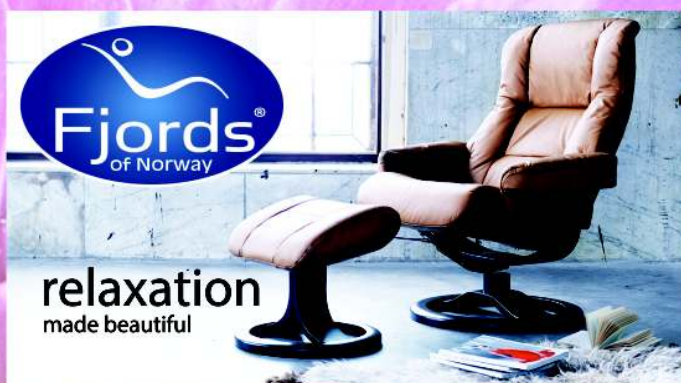

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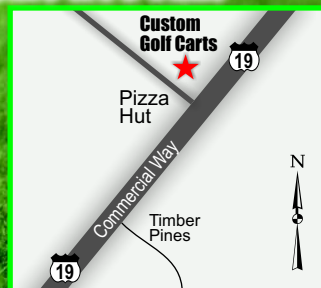

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ASK THE TECHIE



Q: Can you provide some guidelines to help me know when it is safe to open email messages? A neighbor received a message they thought was from a friend and when she opened it her computer got infected with a virus that was very difficult to remove.

A: Even when using the best antivirus protection program available one has to be careful opening email messages. I suggest you pay attention to the **Sender** and **Subject** information before you even open an email. If you see a message from a source you don't recognize, delete and don't open it. Another clue that a message may not be safe is the wording in the email **Subject**. If the **Subject** contains misspellings, doesn't make sense or is inconsistent with what

you'd expect from the sender be wary.

If you decide to open an email, think about whether the message is consistent with the sender's character. If there is no text just a link, clicking could result in a download that will infect your computer. Recently, I've had clients receiving messages from friends with no subject and just a link in the email body. Several clicked on the link and their computers were infected requiring my assistance to remove the virus. Upon investigation, these emails were never actually from the friend. In one case, the friend's computer was infected sending out virus emails without their knowledge.

As an email sender you should always enter appropriate information in the **Subject**. If you're including a link to a web site, include some descriptive text so the recipient will know it's from you. I always include some sort of a signature too.

Also, be wary of political messages that reference controversial topics. This type of message was very prolific during the election season and continues today. My suggestion is, if you are not 100% certain that the sender is authentic and the website link is safe, you delete the email.

Q: When using my mouse, I am sometimes confused as to when to Right-Click or Left-Click. Can you explain the difference and help me understand when to Right or Left Click?

A: For most Windows functions and programs the **Right-Click** button lists the Options or choices available, while the **Left-Click** button selects the Action.

For example: if you **Left-Click** on a Link in an Internet Explorer Browser window, the associated link will open in the current Window. If you **Right-Click** on the Link, a list of choices will appear. To select one of these choices, move the mouse pointer down the list to the item and **Left-Click**. I often use this method when I want to have the new link open in a new Window instead of in the current Window. Try a **Right-Click** on Desktop Icons or within documents, Picture Files etc. as an easy way to explore what options are available. Remember that nothing happens until you **Left-Click**.

In **Windows 8/8.1/10**, **Right-Click** plays an even more important role. If you **Right-Click** on any **Windows 8/10** app, you will see several choices which display additional information or program options. As I tell my clients and class students, **Right-Click** is your friend.

Take a Walk on the Wild Side

May is designated "American Wetlands Month". Wetlands are areas where water covers the soil, or is present either at or near the surface of the soil all year or for varying periods of time during the year. Wetlands vary widely because of regional and local differences in soils, topography,

climate, hydrology, water chemistry, vegetation and other factors, including human disturbance. Paleo Park is designated an "ancient sink hole", it is also called a "sinkhole pond wetland". And to think, it's in our own backyard!

Our guest speaker on **May 30 at 2:00 p.m. in the PAC Room** will be Dr. Tonya Clayton. Dr. Clayton is a contributing author of Sea Level Rise in Florida (University Press of Florida) and author of How to Read a Florida Gulf Coast Beach (University of North Carolina Press). She is also a certified interpretive guide (National Association for Interpretation) and a graduate of the Florida Natural Resources Leadership Institute. Her volunteer work includes service with UF/IFAS Extension and the USF Osher Lifelong Learning Institute. She loves wetlands!

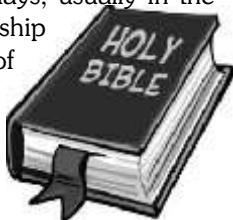

WATER AEROBICS



Finding a cardio activity that you enjoy is an important part of sticking to a weekly fitness routine and achieving your short and long-term wellness goals. These days, many older adults are staving off workout boredom by jumping into the swimming pool.

If you've always had a love for water, aqua aerobics, also known as water aerobics, is a great way to get a full body workout while also taking it easy on your joints.

Water aerobics exercise routines typically involve cardio and strength-training exercises traditionally performed on dry land, only they're done in the safety of the water. This includes walking, jogging, jumping and even using free weights in the pool.

Water provides more resistance than air so your muscles have to work harder in the pool to push against the resistance than they do when you perform land-based exercises. Despite the extra effort, little stress is put on your joints, making aqua aerobics especially attractive to those who suffer from joint-related pain or are recovering from a joint injury or joint replacement surgery.

With the rising popularity of water aerobics, class variations like aqua Zumba, water pilates and pool-based tai chi programs are popping up at pools and community centers across the country. Contact a pool in your area to find out what classes they offer. And if you're looking for a real challenge, aqua cycling, which is where you pedal an exercise or spin bike in the pool (called a submersible ergocycle which is pedaling on you noodle) is a great way to incorporate resistance training into your exercise regime.

6 Health Benefits of Water Aerobics

1. Water aerobics build strong bones. Experts agree that regular exercise promotes bone health and is key for the prevention of osteoporosis, a disease that effects 50% of women and 25% of men over age 50. According to the Aquatic Exercise Association (AEA), shallow-water aquatic exercises can help build and maintain bone mass. The AEA recommends doing water aerobics exercises in conjunction with walking, stair climbing and strength training for best results.

2. Water aerobics is good for those with low back pain. The AEA maintains that deep-water training (which is when you have no contact with the pool floor) can benefit those with low back pain because "deep water is a non-impact environment and significantly reduces the compressive load on the spine. Deep



water is also very effective for training the core muscles, which is important for proper alignment, good posture and back health."

Fitness trainer Marietta Mehanni agrees that postural issues are well supported in the water. "Clients often comment on how much better and taller they feel as the water actually creates traction in the joints, including the vertebra of the spine."

3. Water aerobics reduce arthritis pain. The Arthritis Foundation encourages water exercises, asserting that something as simple as walking in water can help arthritis patients move easier with less joint pain, and feel stronger and more flexible. In fact, the foundation's AEA-managed aquatic program offers, "classes designed specifically for individuals with arthritis, related rheumatic diseases and musculoskeletal conditions," says Julie See, AEA's director of education.

People with arthritis or pain aren't the only ones who can benefit from water exercise. Doing at least two and a half hours of moderate-intensity aerobic exercise—like water aerobics—can help protect you against heart disease, diabetes, and other conditions. Bonus: It can improve your mood.

4. Water aerobics help with recovery after hip replacement surgery. In one past study researchers found that an inpatient aquatic physiotherapy program had a positive effect on early recovery of hip strength after joint replacement surgery. The positive effects largely stemmed from the buoyancy of water, which reduced body weight up to 80%, placing less stress on healing joints.

5. Water aerobics burn calories. While water aerobics exercises may burn fewer calories than a land-based workout, you'll still reap rewards. According to statistics, "a 60-minute workout in the water can burn between 350 to 500 calories." Deep water aerobics can burn up to 800 calories.

6. Water aerobics' group environment is a great motivator. There's no question water aerobics is a social experience. An AARP survey studying the exercise attitude and behaviors of adults between the ages of 50 to 79 found that older adults are more likely to maintain their fitness programs if they'd committed to an exercise group or trainer.

Jacqueline Pattman, national chair for the Aquatic Therapy Association of Chartered Physiotherapists agrees with the findings. "The peer support that people gain by working with others in the water is very valuable in ensuring they stay motivated and have a sense of belonging."

Aqua Aerobics Tips

Before you dive in, here are two tips to consider:

1. Wear water aerobics shoes. While the impact on weight-bearing joints is greatly reduced in the pool, you will still experience some impact stress. Mehanni suggests wearing water aerobic shoes or non-slip socks for added cushioning, shock absorption and comfort. "If you require arch and foot support in everyday life, you'll likely require the same when exercising in the pool," she says.

2. Stay hydrated. Though water cools the body more effectively than air, you will still perspire during vigorous water aerobics routines. Because of this fluid loss, Pattman recommends drinking water after your pool session. Re-hydrating will also help prevent overheating, muscle cramps and heat stroke.

ANGELS IN THE PINES

In the coming weeks (date to be announced) another clothing drive to provide appropriate working clothes for women in the Domestic Abuse programs who are trying to return to the work force will be held.

Fortunately through the generosity of StoreMart Self Storage (352 597-8585) who have donated a large storage locker to the Angels, there is an excellent place to store all the items until they are distributed.

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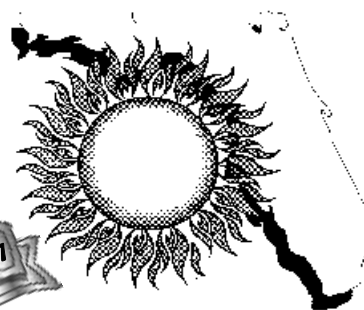
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
