As we transition into the summer season we will be starting some renovation projects on our Clubhouse. We are fortunate that these projects will be funded from your Reserve Fund which you contribute to each month. Twenty-five dollars (\$25) of your monthly assessment goes toward this very valuable asset.

We had a very good month in April. We were better than budget by \$25,000 and we are \$86,000 better than this year's budget and \$72,000 better than last year's. The Food & Beverage loss is \$7,000 better than budget and \$56,000 better than 2008.

With summer arriving, please make sure to advise your guests that the golf course is for golfers, and it is not to be used as a jogging path or for recreational walking.



Design Review Committee

This past month we have handled approximately 90 requests from residents. The majority of requests has been approved. We had to make site visits to five homes prior to approval. The new DRC manuals are available at the front desk. The committee asks that before making a request, please check the policy as stated. If unsure, please contact a committee member for clarification. When asking to replace or add shrubs, trees or plants please enclose a plot plan with your request showing the property lines. All plantings must be at least five feet from the property lines. Heritage Pines is a beautiful place to live; let's ALL work together to keep it that way!

Pool Rules

Hey Residents! It's that time again... to visit our refreshing Clubhouse pool. But before you come relax at the pool, we want to remind you how to have a safe and fun summer by following all the rules.

No food or outside drinks are allowed at the pool. You may buy drinks from the bar window. This is part of a state wide health code.

When your guests are visiting the pool, remember to obtain a wristband from the front desk to wear at the pool. If your guest is not wearing one, they will be asked to get one.

When having children visit the pool, please remember that horse play, such as running, jumping, or yelling will not be tolerated. Only water noodles or flotation devices for toddlers that cannot swim are permitted at the pool.

And this one is for everyone, please remember to shower before entering the pool. This is a major health and safety issue. You must shower to rinse off excess tanning oils or lotions or sweat. A build up of these things leads to clogging in the drains then potentially more issues. Even if you have showered at home, please rinse before entering.

If these rules are violated a staff member will gladly remind you of the rules. If the violation continues you will be asked to leave the pool area.

Thank you for keeping our pool safe and clean.

Policy Regarding Restaurant Walk-Outs

On a regular basis during major resident events, the restaurant has had a problem with residents walking out on their bar tabs for the evening. Currently the restaurant manager or bar manager is closing out the tabs and charging the appropriate member. However, this leaves the server/bartender without a gratuity for the service they provided.

Effective June 1, 2009 any unsigned/open tabs left at the end of the night (when the bar manager is closing) will be subject to an additional 15% service charge. The 15% service charge will go to the appropriate server/bartender. The checks will be signed by either the restaurant manager or bar manager.

We appreciate your cooperation on this matter.

Even the use of a **hand held hose** or **sprinkler container** for watering plants is also restricted?

Residential **car washing** is prohibited?

DID YOU KNOW THAT.....

Violators will be subjected to enforcement and incremental **fines**? First violation is \$130 plus court costs? No warnings will be issued?



This month's recipe, Chilled Strawberry Champagne Soup was a featured appetizer for the Ladybug Golf Invitational on May 5th and also our Mothers Day Buffet. Not only is this a great starter for a delicious

meal, but also great as a dessert. It's so easy you'll be making it every chance you get.

Prep Time: 10 minutes

Ready In: 2 hours, 10 minutes

Servings: 4 Ingredients:

5 Cups Quartered Strawberries

1/4 Cup White Sugar
1 cup champagne

**optional item 1 tablespoon strawberry liquor

Directions:

- 1. Place the strawberries into a blender, and sprinkle with sugar. Process until smooth (if using strawberry liquor, slowly add as the blender is processing).
- 2. Cover, and chill for two hours.

Stir in champagne just before serving.



His fellow golfer had to literally lift the cart off him as others pulled him out from under. Joe suffered a broken clavicle, many fractured ribs and a collapsed lung. Joe was in the hospital five days.

Joe probably won't be playing golf for six weeks. We wish him a speedy recovery.

Lesson to be learned is that whenever working on your golf cart. TURN OFF THE IGNITION AND REMOVE THE KEY. Removing the ground (negative) cable from the battery will afford even greater safety.

point, you still post an adjusted gross score, for handicap purposes. (Section 5-1e)

DID YOU KNOW.....?

......that dimples on a golf ball increase the amount of turbulence that is in the air surrounding the ball? The ball flies slower, but spins faster as it flies essentially helping the air surrounding it

to lift the ball. That is why the dimples allow the ball to stay in the air longer and increase a player's overall performance.

.....that Amateur Golfer Bobby Jones, in the final playoff of the 1925 U.S Open, called a two stroke penalty on himself, when he saw his ball move in the rough when he was setting up for his shot? He called the Rules Official, who questioned some of the spectators and no one saw his ball move, so the Official let Jones make the call himself. He lost the Playoff by one stroke. Bobby Jones founded the Masters in 1934. The USGA Sportsmanship Award is named the Bob Jones Award in his honor.

Community Emergency Response Team - CERT

The Heritage Pines Community Emergency Response Team offers the following reminders to be prepared for storm season:

Lightning

If you witness lightning strike a home or building, call 911 and report lightning struck that <u>specific address</u> to the fire department immediately. Next, try to contact the residents or people in charge at that address. Every minute counts after lightning strikes to prevent full engulfment of structure by fire.

Protect your home and electronic devices. Lightning rods, power company meter surge protectors, and surge protecting power strips can protect your investments.

Tornado

Every home should have a weather radio. We do not have tornado sirens. A weather radio will go off signaling you when a tornado warning is issued for our area. When a tornado warning is issued, that means a tornado has been sighted. You should go to an interior safe room until danger passes.

Also consider getting a self charging weather radio for use when the power is out. Tornados often follow a hurricane when power may be out.

Hurricane

Residents going north for the summer should store all exterior items, including garden hoses. Hurricane force winds turn one residents stuff into missals to break a neighbor's windows.

Snowbirds should always leave a key and emergency contact information with a neighbor.

Make a plan NOW. Those using computers can go to www.FloridaDisaster.org and click on "Get-a-Plan". After answering a few questions the site will prepare your personal disaster plan, route your evacuation, calculate the amount of water your family will need and give you check lists to mark off as you prepare. You will get a 12 page plan specific to your family and pets including things to do after the disaster. The site will even email a copy of your plan to friends or relatives out of state.

Your Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is always working to be prepared to be the first responders charged with saving and sustaining life after a disaster in our community. Year around residents, willing to complete CERT training, able to walk 1 mile, lift 40 pounds and attend the monthly meeting on the last Tuesday of each month should contact Janet Cahill, CERT Operations Director, jcahill@tampabay.rr.com to get started.



What are Floaters?

When people reach middle age, the vitreous gel may start to thicken or shrink forming clumps or strands inside the eye. This gel pulls away from the back wall of the eye causing a "posterior vitreous detachment." The appearance of floaters could be a normal event or it could be a symptom of retinal problems, such as detachment, tear, or bleeding. If it is associated with flashing lights or curtains a dilated eve exam should be performed urgently. Contact your eye MD if you develop new floaters, especially if you are over 45 years of age.





As of this writing there are 85 homes listed in the MLS for sale in Heritage Pines. This number hasn't fluctuated that much over the last couple of years so it move can be considered normal.
