## COMPANION ANIMAL CARE CHECKLIST

Please have necessary corrections made for anything on this list that is insufficient in your facility prior to the first inspection appointment.
___ Daily observation of all animals within facility
___ All animals requiring veterinary care have been treated. Veterinary records have been updated. Outdated medications have been disposed of properly. Attending veterinarian has made a facility inspection within 12 months. Have adequate number of employees to maintain facility. All animals have convenient access to food and water.
All feed and water bowls have been sanitized within the last 2 weeks All bags of feed and bedding are in a leak-proof containers with tight fitting lids. All unopened bags of feed is stored off of the floor and 4 inches away from the walls. All enclosures are spot cleaned daily including litter boxes.
Areas behind and below enclosures have been cleaned as necessary. All enclosures have been sanitized within the last 2 weeks. All surfaces in contact with animals are impervious to moisture. Surfaces within enclosures are free of excessive rust, sharp points and edges. Mesh floors are of sufficient size to prevent feet from falling through. Resting boards are present for all wire mesh floors and concrete. Resting board present for cats.
Adequate floor space is available for all animals.
All dogs have a minimum of six inches headroom in enclosure.
All cats have minimum of 24 inches.
Nursing mothers have additional spaced required for the offspring.
All animals in outside facilities have necessary shelters.
Acclimation statement is present and signed by a veterinarian.
All outside shelters have wind and rain breaks in place.
All outside shelters have sufficient bedding.
All outside facilities have sufficient shade structures.
Temperature controlled areas are between 45-85 degrees.
All animal areas within facility are well ventilated.
Doors, flaps, gates, etc.. are in good repair and operate properly.
All drains are functioning properly.
Pest control measures are in place as necessary. Items not necessary for animal husbandry are not kept within animal area.
All animals have a means of identification.
Records of animals on hand have been update and are accurate.
All food and cleaning supplies are stored separately.
All animals have adequate grooming and free of excessive nail length.
